The Reserve Bank of India Governor Shaktikanta Das led Monetary Policy Committee (MPC) has decided unanimously to keep the policy repo rate unchanged at 6.5 per cent. This is the fourth time in a row that the MPC has decided to maintain the status quo on the repo rate. The repo rate is the interest rate at which the RBI lends money to commercial banks. The decision was taken during the three-day MPC meeting of the RBI which began on Wednesday. Announcing the bimonthly monetary policy yesterday, the RBI Governor said, the decision was taken after a detailed assessment of the evolving macroeconomic and financial developments and the outlook. He said, the RBI will remain focused on withdrawal of accommodation to tame inflation and support growth. The RBI Governor said the Central bank has also retained the real Gross Domestic Product (GDP) forecast for financial year 2023-24 at 6.5 percent. Similarly, the Consumer Price Index -based inflation for financial year 2023-24 is projected at 5.4 percent.



The Additional District Magistrate (ADM) of Sivasagar, Assam has imposed night curfew in a 5-kilometer belt on the Assam side of Sivasagar district, which shares a border with Nagaland. The night curfew which came into effect since September 7 from 6 PM to 6 AM will remain in place for a duration of 60 days. The decision to enforce the night curfew was initiated as a precautionary measure to deter antisocial elements, extremists, and unlawful activities from crossing the Assam-Nagaland border within the Sivasagar district. According to the order, during the period of the night curfew, the movement of any person, group of persons, or vehicular traffic is strictly prohibited within the specified area. However, certain exemptions have been granted. Magistrates, security personnel from the Army, CRPF (Central Reserve Police Force), and Police, as well as civil officials who are deployed on duty, are exempted from the purview of the prohibitory order.

Iranian human rights activist Narges Mohammadi has been awarded the Nobel Peace Prize 2023 for her fight against the oppression of women. She remains in jail as she becomes the 19th woman to win the Nobel peace Prize. She is among the leading human rights activists in Iran. Mohammadi has been arrested 13 times, convicted five times, sentenced to a total of 31 years in prison and got 154 lashes. The Norwegian Nobel Committee has decided to award Narges Mohammadi for her fight against the oppression of women in Iran and her fight to promote human rights and freedom for all.
