Israel's death toll in the ongoing conflict with Hamas has crossed 700 and the number of injured has crossed 2,100. President of Tanzania Samia Suluhu Hassan yesterday arrived in New Delhi on a four day State visit to India. This is her first visit to India since the assumption of the office of President. On her arrival at the airport, she was received by Union Minister of State for Education Annapurna Devi. The Tanzanian President will be accorded a ceremonial

welcome at the forecourt of Rashtrapati Bhawan today. Thereafter she will participate in a wreath-laying ceremony to be held at the Rajghat. She will also hold a detailed bilateral dialogue with Prime Minister Narendra Modi. In the evening she will meet President Droupadi Murmu.

India and Saudi Arabia yesterday signed a Memorandum of Understanding, MoU in the fields of Electrical Interconnections, Green and Clean Hydrogen and Supply Chains. The MoU was signed between the Union Minister for Power and New and Renewable Energy R.K. Singh and the Minister of Energy, Government of Saudi Arabia, Abdulaziz bin Salman Al-Saud on the sidelines of the Middle East and North Africa Climate Week in RiyadhThe MoU aims to establish a general framework for cooperation between the two countries in the field of electrical interconnection, exchange of electricity during peak times and emergencies, co-production of green and clean hydrogen and renewable energy, and also establishing secure, reliable and resilient supply chains of material.

India and Pacific Asia Travel Association will jointly promote Travel for LiFE in the Asia-Pacific region. During the recently concluded 46th edition of Pacific Asia Travel Association Travel Mart 2023 in New Delhi, PATA has committed to expand Travel for LiFE in the Asia-Pacific region. Travel for LiFE initiative was showcased at the mart by the Ministry across all the events and it generated huge interest from international travel trade community.

Curtains came down on the 19th Asian Games at the Hangzhou Olympics Stadium in China yesterday with a glittering closing ceremony. The baton for the next Asian Games was passed on to Nagoya, Japan for 2026. More than 12,000 athletes from 45 nations competed in 40 sports at the event. The Indian contingent won 107 medals- 28 gold, 38 silver, and 41 bronze at Hangzhou. In the previous edition of the Games at Jakarta in 2018, India was only able to secure 70 medals. This is the first time that the country has crossed the benchmark of 101 medals in any of the three major Games including the Olympics, the Commonwealth Games and the Asian Games.
