National Centre for Vector Borne Diseases Control (NCVBDC), Directorate of Health & Family Welfare Nagaland organised a three-day training for medical officers on clinical management of vector borne diseases from March 21 to 23 at Kohima. Mission Director, NHM, Dr. E. Motsuthung Patton emphasizing on the issues of high surge of dengue cases reported last year, urged all to be more vigilant for the coming year to curb the diseases. He urged the officers to be sincere in their work at their respective place of posting. Deputy Director NCVBDC Dr. Tinurenla Anichari informed that all suspected malaria cases be referred to the laboratory for blood smear collection and examination before starting treatment. She said all positive cases get treatment as per National drug policy within 24 hours of reporting with confirmed malaria positive cases and ensure sufficient stocks of antimalarials. State Consultant Public Health & Training Imsubenla said for the past seven years no malaria death case has been reported.
