The Union Ministry of Home Affairs has stated that the recently notified rules for Citizenship Amendment Act (CAA) 2019 will not impact the indigenous communities in Nagaland. The state of Nagaland will remain out of the purview of CAA 2019, it said in a press release. The ministry noted that the Act exempts all areas regulated by provisions of Inner Line Permit and the Sixth Schedule of the Indian Constitution. This means it will not be implemented in most tribal areas across the Northeastern states. The 6th Schedule covers autonomous tribal-dominated areas Assam, Meghalaya, Mizoram and Tripura, while ILP is in force in Arunachal Pradesh, Nagaland, Mizoram and Manipur. The ministry, in its release, said the government is committed to protect rights and interests of indigenous communities of the North East Region and give a major development push through 'Act East Policy'.



The central government has launched a new portal for persons who are eligible for Indian citizenship under Citizenship Amendment Act-2019. People who want to apply can log on to https://indiancitizenshiponline.nic.in. Union Home Ministry will also launch a mobile app 'CAA-2019' to facilitate applications through mobile app. The

government yesterday notified the Citizenship (Amendment) Rules, 2024 under the CAA-2019.



President Droupadi Murmu today asserted that India is marching ahead to become the third largest economy in the world and urged Mauritian people to become part of New Delhi's growth journey. Addressing the Indian Diaspora in Mauritius, she lauded the role of India origin people in the growth and economic prosperity of Mauritius, while also keeping their tradition alive. Murmu said, India is giving priority to education and empowering the youth to become a knowledge economy. She said, steps have been taken to set up new Universities and colleges especially in rural areas. Murmu also participated in the National Day celebrations of Mauritius as the Chief Guest. Indian Navy Helicopter and Indian Navy contingent also participated in the celebrations along with their Mauritius counterparts.



Prime Minister Narendra Modi today said the vision of a developed India is not possible without a self-reliant India. He said that if the country wants to be developed, it will have to reduce dependence on others. The Prime Minister was addressing a programme after witnessing 'Bharat Shakti' exercise in Pokhran, Rajasthan, showcasing the prowess of indigenously manufactured defence equipment across the three services. He said, today the country is emphasizing self-reliance in every sector, from edible oil to modern fighter aircraft. He said that warriors of the three defence forces are using modern equipment and weapons made in India, which is the strength of the country. Modi added that in the last ten years, the Central Government has taken many big steps to make the country self-reliant in the defense sector.



Union Health Minister Dr Mansukh Mandaviya today launched a credit program for small scale entrepreneurs to set-up and upscale PM Bhartiya Janaushadhi Kendras. Under the program, Small Industries Development Bank of India, SIDBI, will provide low-interest loans to entrepreneurs without any physical guarantee. Dr Mandaviya said, loan of upto 4 lakh rupees will be provided under the program. The minister added that the no-interest feature of the program will help small scale entrepreneurs to expand, upscale and upgrade their Janaushadhi Kendras. SIDBI said the

loan will be issued online, and borrowers will only need to input details such as GSTIN and mobile number to avail the loan.



Union Minister of Sports and Youth Affairs Anurag Singh Thakur today launched Khelo India Rising Talent Identification (KIRTI) programme from Chandigarh. Thakur said, the primary objective of KIRTI is to identify and support youth sporting talents at the grassroots level across various disciplines. The KIRTI model will feature a pyramidical structure, identifying talented sportspersons from grassroots levels to the development of elite athletes for international excellence. This will be conducted through scientifically designed tests, ensuring accuracy and fairness in the selection process. Thakur said, Bharat Benchmarks will also be established for performance measurement, providing a unified tool for performance assessment across various disciplines. On the occasion, the Minister also announced to open two new National Centre of Excellence for Sports dedicated to women where only women sportspersons will be trained.



Advisor for CAWD and Taxes, Kudecho Khamo today shared his intolerance against proxy teachers and stated that it should not be allowed. He said this while addressing the inaugural programme of additional classrooms constructed under Samagra Shiksha Nagaland at GHS Japan Riba Chozuba. He urged Village councils and Village Education Committees not to allow proxy teachers and to inform him so that it can be taken up with the government. Khamo maintained that teaching is a serious business which requires full-time individuals who are willing to build and nurture young minds. The Advisor also expressed concern over encroachment of lands in the state which has become a stumbling block for developmental activities. He asked the people not to misuse Article 371 (A) but to use it for rights that provide constitutional guarantees. Further, Khamo encouraged the students to dream big with strong determination and become personalities who work for the welfare of the society.



A training cum skill development of women leaders under National Clean Air Programme was conducted yesterday at Dimapur. EAC Dimapur Imlijungla Lemtur, in her welcome address, noted that Dimapur is among two cities in Nagaland to be declared non-attainment city as its air quality standards have been below nation average for five consecutive years. Noting that one of the sources of pollutant is burning of waste, she called for efficient waste management techniques to reduce air pollution. Dimapur Municipal Council Administrator Manpai Phom emphasised on the importance of action at the community and household levels in tackling the issue of waste management.



North Eastern Indira Gandhi Regional Institute of Health & Medical Sciences, NEIGHRIMS, in Shillong has informed that as of this year, individuals seeking admission to the B.Sc. Nursing course 2024-25 at its College of Nursing, will be required to take the NEET-UG entrance examination conducted by the National Testing Agency, 2024. In a notice, it said no separate entrance exam will be conducted. NEIGHRIMS said admission will be based on merit determined by NEET-UG scores, following the standard procedure used by all central government institutes.
