In Arunachal Pradesh, repolling at 8 polling stations in the Arunachal West Parliamentary Constituency was conducted smoothly and peacefully today with a total voter turnout of 79.8 percent. The repollings were held at one polling stations each at Bameng and Nyapin assembly constituencies, two in Rumgong and four in Nacho Assembly constituencies. Earlier, the Election Commission of India had declared the polling held on April 19 this month at these polling stations for Parliamentary and Assembly elections void and fixed April 24 as the date of the repoll. Simultaneous elections for the two parliamentary constituencies and new Legislative Assembly of Arunachal Pradesh was held on April 19 in a single phase.

The Supreme Court today reserved its verdict on a batch of petitions seeking a cent per cent cross-verification of the vote count in Electronic Voting machines (EVMs) with Voter Verifiable Paper Audit Trail (VVPAT) paper slips. A Bench comprising Justices Sanjiv Khanna and Dipankar Datta asked the Election Commission of India (ECI) about EVM functionality and security during the hearing. The ECI assured the court that EVMs are secure and tamper-proof, with built-in security features. They mentioned that over 41,000 random verifications so far, matching over four crore VVPAT paper slips. Meanwhile, the court expressed confidence in the ECI but hinted at potential reforms to improve the electoral process. However, it rejected the idea of returning to paper ballots.

Murmu today while President Draupadi addressing convocation ceremony of Indian Forest Service Probationers at the Forest Research Institute in Dehradun highlighted the pressing issue of climate change and underscored the critical role of forest conservation in combating its effects. Speaking on the occasion, the President said that mankind had deliberately made the mistake of forgetting the importance of forests. She stressed that humans were not the owners but the protectors of the earth's invaluable resource and encouraged probation officers to shoulder the vital duties of conserving, promoting, and nurturing forests. She also expressed confidence that they would wholeheartedly fulfil this crucial responsibility. During the convocation ceremony, as many as 99 probationers from the Indira Gandhi National Forest Academy, along with two trainee officers from the friendly nation of Bhutan, graduated from the academy's 2022-24 Course.
