The withdrawal of nominations for the second phase of Lok Sabha elections will end today. Scrutiny of nominations for this phase was held on Friday except in Jammu and Kashmir. Scrutiny in Jammu and Kashmir took place on Saturday. The filing of nominations for the second phase ended on Thursday. In this phase, 88 Lok Sabha seats in 12 States and Union Territories along with the remaining part of the Outer Manipur Lok Sabha constituency will go to polls on the 26th of this month.

It is stated that to safeguard the future generations of the Naga society, the civil societies under the banner of Nagaland Baptist Church Council approached the Nagaland legislature to enact law to control the use of alcohol in the state.
