NEWS IN ORDER:-

CAMPAIGN:

Congress president Mallikarjun Kharge said that his party would fulfil all promises for the people. He was addressing the media persons in Guwahati yesterday. He criticised Prime Minister Narendra Modi for failing to fulfil the promises made to people during the last 10 years. The Congress President slammed the BJP government for failing to provide two crore jobs every year and doubling the income of farmers. Later in the day, he attended a public meeting in the Barpeta district to support the Congress candidate. Meanwhile, Senior BJP Leader Amit Shah has expressed confidence that India will be among the top three economies in the world during the third term of Prime Minister Narendra Modi, while addressing a public rally at Porbandar in Gujarat yesterday.

ELECTION:

Nagaland will conduct the Urban Local Bodies elections in all 39 Municipal and Town councils on June 26th this year. The state cabinet has given the administrative approval during a meeting held on Friday. The municipal elections will be held in the state with 33 per cent women reservation for the first time. Meanwhile, the Government has fixed 29th April as the date of publication of the Election programme. Counting and declaration of votes will take place on 29th June. The period for filling of nomination is from 7th to 11th June upto 3PM, while 20th June is the last date for withdrawal of candidatures. Scrutiny of validly presented nominations papers will be taken on 13th June and applications for revision of the order of authority scrutinising the nomination will be from 15th to 18th June till 3PM. Date of re-poll if any, has been fixed on June 28.

ATTACK:

In Manipur, two CRPF jawan- a Sub Inspector and a Head Constable succumbed to bullet injury when suspected armed miscreants attacked them from nearby hill range. According to Police report, the incident occurred at

2nd IRB Post situated at Naranseina Village under Moirang Police Station in Bishnupur district. The jawans of (B) Company of 128 Battalian CRPF were posted there to protect nearby Meetei villages. Armed miscreants from nearby hill ranges heavily attacked the post and killed two jawan and other two sustained bullet injury. Additional security forces rushed to the site for search operation.

OPERATION:

In Manipur, a combined team of Central Armed Police Force and State Forces conducted mass search and combing operation in the nearby hill ranges of Naranseina Village under Bishnupur district yesterday and recovered arms and ammunition. The operation was conducted after armed miscreants attacked the CRPF Post stationed at Naranseina Villages, which claimed the lives of a Sub Inspector and a Head Constable. During the combing operation, the security forces recovered four rifles, two Chinese Hand Grenade, 145 live rounds ammunition, 197 empty cases, 32 projectiles, a walkie talkie set and others. The security forces also destroyed three bunkers installed by the miscreants in the hill ranges. Meanwhile, Manipur Chief Minister N. Biren Singh condemned the incident and said that those culprits will be booked under the laws and given befitting punishment.

VETERINARY:

Meghalaya State Veterinary Council in Shillong yesterday observed the World Veterinary Day at the Directorate Animal Husbandry & Veterinary in Shillong, on the theme, "Veterinarians are Essential Health Workers". Secretary of the Animal Husbandry & Veterinary Department, Smt. R. M. Kurbah, in her address, stressed on the importance of collaboration between the health and veterinary departments to address preventive and curative aspects of diseases. Speaking on the occasion, Veterinary and Animal Husbandry Minister, A.L Hek emphasized the importance of sincerity and responsibility in sustaining the department's operations and advocated for building a strong brand image for the veterinary department.

CONDEMN:

In Meghalaya, Nartiang residents yesterday condemned the petrol bomb attack on the residence of Deputy Chief Minister Sniawbhalang Dhar, on Friday. Traditional heads, church leaders among others expressed their anguish over the incident. They demanded that the police and the law enforcing authorities to take action and arrest the culprits. Nartiang residents were shocked over the first such incident against the deputy chief minister.

HEATWAVE:

India Meteorological Department has issued a red alert for severe heatwave conditions in Odisha and Gangetic West Bengal for the next few days. On hot and humid weather, the IMD said, these conditions are very likely to prevail over Tripura, Assam and Meghalaya from today. The Meghalaya government had earlier issued an advisory directing educational institutes across the state not to organise sports or any outdoor activities to avoid the ill effect of the heatwave on children.
