## **POLLING PARTIES**

In Manipur, the polling teams for far flung areas have started their journey to designated polling stations for the second phase Lok Sabha Election. The Election Office of Pherzawl district has dispatched the first batch of polling teams from Tuibong yesterday. The polling teams deputed for sixteen remote polling stations under Tipaimukh assembly segment under Outer Manipur Parliamentary Constituency were airlifted along with EVMs in an Indian Air Force chopper. These polling stations are more than 260 kilometres away from the Dispersal Centre and have poor road connectivity. The polling teams for fifteen polling stations under Pherzawl district also proceeded towards their respective destinations by road yesterday. The remaining polling stations of two assembly segments under Pherzawl district will be dispatched by road today.

## **REPOLLING**

In Arunachal Pradesh, fresh polls are being held at 8 polling stations of 4 Assembly constituencies under Arunachal West Parliamentary Constituency amid tight security today from 6 am to 2 PM. Scrutiny of Form 17A of these polling stations will be done immediately after the poll today. The Election Commission of India had declared the polling held on April 19 this month at these polling stations for Parliamentary and Assembly elections as void. Repolling is being held at one polling stations each in Bameng and Nyapin assembly constituencies, two in Rungong and four in Nacho Assembly Constituency. All these polling stations are in Arunachal West Parliamentary Constituency. Simultaneous elections for the two parliamentary constituencies and new Legislative Assembly of Arunachal Pradesh were held on April 19 in a single phase.

## **APPEAL**

Meghalaya Chief Minister Conrad K Sangma has condemned the murders in East Garo Hills bordering Assam on the 17<sup>th</sup> of this month and urged the people not to take law into their hands. He said that such actions have no place in our society and stand as a grave violation of our shared humanity. He also appealed to the residents both in Assam and Meghalaya to refrain from resorting to vigilante justice or any form of retaliation. He said that the authorities in Meghalaya have already taken swift action by initiating a thorough investigation into the matter and he assured to bring the perpetrators of this crime to justice.

## **WEATHER**

Widespread light to moderate rainfall and snowfall accompanied with isolated thunderstorm is expected over North East India till the 29<sup>th</sup> of this month. India Meteorological Department has forecast rainfall over Sub-Himalayan West Bengal, Odisha and Sikkim for the next two to three days. Light to moderate rainfall is likely over Arunachal Pradesh, Assam, Meghalaya, Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram and Tripura.

The results can also be accessed on its Android Mobile App. Meanwhile, printed form of provisional Result Gazettes will be issued to all registered institutes of the Board along with marksheets and pass certificates. The Board has asked the Centre Superintendent or authorized representatives to collect the documents between May 3 and 6. ## **DAY**

In Manipur, the Khongjom Day was observed yesterday paying tribute to brave souls who fought against the British during the Khongjom Battle of Anglo-Manipuri War in 1891. The State level observation was held at the Khongjom War Memorial Complex at Kheba Ching in Khongjom of Thoubal district. Manipur Governor Sushri Anusuiya Uikey, Chief Minister N. Biren Singh, cabinet ministers, MLAs, top civil and police officers attended the observation. A large number of people also joined the observation. As part of the observation, the Governor and Chief Minister led others in laying wreaths followed by guard of honour, general salute, reverse arms, sounding of the last post, and a two-minute silence. April 23 is observed as Khongjom Day every year in Manipur.
