POLLING:

In Manipur, voting for the second phase of Lok Sabha elections was held yesterday in the remaining 13 assembly segments under Outer Manipur Parliamentary Constituency with 76.46 voters' turnout till 5 PM. The Mao assembly segment of Senapati district which is the home polling station of Independent candidate, S. Kho John registered the highest voters' turnout with 89.84 percent while Jiribam assembly segment registered 59.85 percent becoming the lowest voters turnout among the 13 assembly segments. The voting was conducted at 848 polling stations and nine special polling stations spread across eight districts of the State from 7 AM to 4 PM. Four candidates are in fray for the lone Outer Manipur Parliamentary Constituency seat. The voting in 15 assembly segments of Outer Manipur Parliamentary Constituency was held in first phase on April 19.

TRIPURA:

Braving the scorching heat, voters cast their votes in the second phase of Lok Sabha polls for Tripura East Lok Sabha constituency yesterday. According to Election Commission data, Tripura recorded the voting percentage at 79.46. Election officials said that heavy security arrangements have been made for the Tripura East seat spread across six districts to foil any incidents of violence. Meanwhile Around 15 voters, including women, were injured when a swarm of bees attacked the electorates, who were in the queue to cast their votes at Barabill area of Tripura's Khowai district. Election officials said that Fire and Emergency Service personnel rushed to the spot and shifted the affected voters to Khowai district hospital. The bee attack caused nervousness and anxiety among the voters, and they ran away from the queue. The beehive near the polling station was destroyed later.

KHARGE:

In Assam, Congress President Mallikarjun Kharge will address an election rally for the party's Barpeta Lok Sabha candidate today. He will also interact with media persons in Guwahati before wrapping up his visit. Assam Chief Minister and senior BJP leader Himanta Biswa Sarma will also hold rallies today. The voting for the third phase of Lok Sabha elections on May 7 will cover four Lok Sabha seats.

ULB:

In Nagaland, the Urban Local Bodies elections will be conducted in all the 39 Municipal and Town councils on 26th June. The state cabinet has given the administrative approval during a meeting held in Kohima yesterday. The municipal elections will be held with 33 per cent women reservation for the first time. The period for filing of nominations is from 7th to 11th June upto 3PM. Scrutiny of nominations papers is on 13th June while 20th June is the last date for withdrawal of candidatures. The date for re-polling if any, has been fixed on 28th June. Counting of votes will take place on 29th June.

CRPF:

In Manipur, two CRPF jawan, a Sub Inspector and a Head Constable succumbed to bullet injuries when suspected armed miscreants attacked them from a nearby hill range. According to Police report, the incident occurred at 2nd IRB Post situated at Naranseina village under Moirang Police Station in Bishnupur district yesterday. Armed miscreants from a nearby hill range attacked the post which led to the killing of two jawans and two others sustained bullet injury. A case has been registered and the investigation is going on.

RESULTS:

In Nagaland, Ms. Mhachilo Yanthan from Christian Higher Secondary School, Dimapur emerged as the top scorer in the High School Leaving Certificate examination, the results of which were declared by the Nagaland Board of School Education yesterday. Ms. Mhachilo Yanthan secured 98.83% with a total of 593 marks. Ms. Ketsino Jane Frances from St. Paul School, Phesama, secured the second position with 98.67%, while Ms. Pabitra Deb from Holy Cross Higher Secondary School Dimapur, and Ms. Amina Begum from M.G.M Higher Secondary School, Dimapur, shared the third position securing 98.50%. In the results of the Higher Secondary School Leaving Certificate examination, Ms. Keletsole Mekro from Dainty Buds topped the Arts Stream with 97.40%, Mr Satyam Kumar Jaiswal from Holy Cross Higher Secondary School, Dimapur excelled in the Commerce stream with 98.40%, and Ms. Narola Imsong from Queen Mary Higher Secondary Residential School, Mokokchung, led the Science Stream with 96.20%.
