Chief Electoral Officer (CEO) Nagaland, Vyasan R said the preparation for the counting of votes to 18th Lok Sabha election on June 4 is in full swing while assuring that the counting process will be a seamless exercise and an incident free vote counting. Speaking exclusively to Akashvani News Kohima today, Vyasan said, the counting process will begin at 8 AM and it will take place simultaneously across all 16 districts of the state. He said apart from the 16 district headquarters and one Pughoboto ADC headquarter, counting of postal ballots will be taken up at the Returning Officer (RO) Office located at Commissioner's Office in Kohima. With these, the CEO informed that Nagaland will have 17 counting centres with one as the postal ballot counting centre. Vyasan said ECI will be deputing 21 counting observers in the state during the counting exercise. He also informed that in all the districts, EVMs, VVPAT counting statutory forms and others are kept in strong rooms which are guarded by a Three-tier security cordon. He said the strong rooms are guarded by the CAPF forces with 24 hours CCTV coverage with power backup in two factors for power supply. The CEO also informed that to ensure counting takes place in a timely manner, trainings were already conducted across all the districts while in some districts trial runs were also being organised. He said as per the ECI instructions counting hall arrangements will have to be completed by May 31 which is three clear days ahead of counting and for that the

districts are preparing for the same to ensure that counting arrangements are well in place. In terms of information dissemination, he said the ECI has a very strong results portal and through that the counting results will be declared which will be available for everyone through their mobile phones and other gadgets. Further, Vyasan said the districts will send their respective results sheets which will be compiled by the RO who is the Commissioner Nagaland to declare the final result. Additionally, the CEO said the election office will be setting up mobile vans in different focal points in Kohima town to display the election results of not only Nagaland but the other of the parts country as well.

Nagaland Police has alerted public on fraud message of SBI reward. The Police said a message with a header SBI rewardz along with a link to download "SBI Reward App" is being circulated. The Police said, the message is fraud and cautioned the public not to download it.

After four days of extensive search, NDRF, SDRF and DDMA have successfully recovered the second body of the drowned youth in Doyang at 9:55 this morning. The deceased was identified as a 24 years old Thungchio Patton. The body has been handed over to the family for the final rites. The first body was recovered on May 29 afternoon and was identified as 20 years old Elanthung Ngullie. It may be mentioned that the incident occurred on May 27 when the two victims, along with three companions, were headed to work in Doyang dam when their boat capsized due to a sudden strong wind. The three others managed to swim to safety.

A Consultation Workshop on Documenting Terminologies used by various Naga and non-Naga Communities regarding Disability and its Implications was held today at the ANMA Integrated Development Association Campus Dimapur. The workshop was organised jointly by the Office of the State Commissioner for Persons with Disabilities, Nagaland, and Prodigals' Home, Dimapur. State Commissioner for Persons with Disabilities, Diethono Nakhro said that although

People with Disabilities' are referred to a single population, it encompasses a diverse group with varying needs. She pointed out the multiple barriers such as attitudinal, environmental, and institutional hinders their full participation in society. Nakhro called for the use of positive and inclusive language to promote respect and inclusion for people with disabilities. MD (Physical Medicine and Rehabilitation) and in-charge of the District Disability Rehabilitation Centre, Dr. Imlitemsu Ozukum said, differently-abled individuals can accomplish the same tasks as others but in different ways. Director of Prodigals' Home, K. Ela, said the initiative to document disability terminologies began in 2023 and emphasized the importance of collaborative consultation for progress and clarity in the effort.



The two-day long 54th Tenyidie annual seminar organised by Ura Academy got underway at Ura Academy Hall in Kohima on the theme "Language: The root of Our existence". Addressing the inaugural function, Author Dr Visier Sanyü said language is the foundation of civilization adding that it is the glue that holds everything together. He said language is vital for national identity which is shaped by the needs of culture in the changing landscape of the world. Sanyü also expressed concern that if not careful, Nagamese will corrode other languages and in this regard emphasised on the need to let Tenyidie remain as a foundation for the Tenyimi community. Earlier, President Chakhesang Public Organization Vezuhu Keyho, pointed that 10 Naga tribes are identified as Tenyimi with five each in Nagaland and Manipur, and added that Ura Academy is one of the unifying platform for the communities. He also stressed on the need for more development with inclusion of more words from all the 10 tribes of the Tenyimi. On the occasion Ura Academy President Dr Shurhozelie Liezietsu released two tenyidie books. Ura Academy meritorious awards were also given to HSLC and HSSLC subject toppers in Tenyidie (MIL) and HSSLC toppers in Music subject. Award was also given to highest mark scorer in BA (Tenyidie Honours) course Following the inaugural session, Tenyidie Kephrünuoko Krotho conclave was held followed by competition on solo, story writing, essay writing and poetry writing. The two day event will culminate tomorrow with a valedictory function at 4:30 PM.

United Sangtam Students' Conference (USSC) has expressed its concern on the deteriorating road condition of National Highway- 202 particularly the stretch between New Chungliyimti Village to Angangba Village under Tuensang. In a letter addressed to the Executive Engineer, PWD National Highway Tuensang, the USSC said the current state of this vital transportation link poses a great threat to the safety and well-being of the citizens of Longkhim-Chare and all the commuters travelling along the stretch highway to and from Tuensang HQ, Shamator, and Noklak districts respectively. The conference stated that it strongly advocates for the welfare of the general public and urged the concerned department to address the matter with urgency and utmost priority. Further, the USSC cautioned that if any untoward incidents occur due to these poor road conditions, the Department will be held responsible. The conference also expressed discuss further if its willingness to the matter the need arises.

The Chakhesang Youth Front (CYF) has reiterated the Chakhesang Public Organization resolution of not to allow any illegal collection or demand in the ongoing two lane construction and other developmental activities from any group/s within Chakhesang jurisdiction. They also reiterated the CPO resolution to insist all the contractors for timely completion of the projects and quality work as per the laid down guidelines and specifications. The CYF also demanded the contractor to immediately resume the package-2 stretch road construction from Chakhabama to RD Block. The CYF appealed to all the contractors, firms or companies not to compromise the quality of work, and emphasize on timely completion of their respective projects. They also assured to continue to extend its fullest support and cooperation wherever required, in curbing the anti social elements that may hamper the progress of the projects.
