Nodal Officer of Integrated Health Campaign, Nagaland State AIDS Control Society (NSACS) and Deputy Director of Sexually transmitted infections, Dr. Zaiwang today said districts of Dimapur, Chumoukedima, and Niuland have an estimated 9,662 people living with HIV. However, the actual number of PLHIVs could be significantly higher due to underreporting and social stigma. He was speaking during the launch of Integrated Health Campaign in Dimapur. Comparing to India's HIV prevalence rate of 0.22 percent, the officer noted that Nagaland's rate is alarmingly higher at 1.61 percent, making it second highest in the country after Mizoram. Dr. Zaiwang reported that out of the estimated 9,662 PLHIV, only 3,034 are receiving antiretroviral therapy, ART as of March 2024. This leaves 6,628 individuals without treatment, highlighting urgent need for increased outreach and support services. The campaign data also detailed targeted interventions for high-risk groups, including injecting drug users, female injecting drug users, men who have sex with men, transgender individuals, female sex workers, truckers, and migrants. EAC Dimapur Imlijungla urged various stakeholders to work together to ensure that these programs are effective and sustainable. Imlijungla stressed on early screening and prevention, adding that health issues among pregnant women was high. From April 2023 to March 2024, a total of 48 thousand 777 individuals were tested for HIV across Nagaland, with 960 testing positive. Among these, 919 were general clients, and 41 were antenatal care clients, indicating a significant number of HIV cases among pregnant women.

Media and information Secretary of BASN, Sarah Konyak informed that entries will be open for 18 years and above with a registration fee of 1000 rupees from tomorrow. She said participants should be an indigenous of Nagaland. Nagaland Voluntary Consumers' Organisation, NVCO has come out in support of the state government direction to enforce banning of unauthorized collection of money by NGOs. NVCO President Kezhokhoto Savi appealed that as per the said direction, district administration and police authorities to strictly enforce the order to prevent and curb unauthorized collection of money by union, association, NGOs or any other private and community organizations by whatever name. The NVCO also

expressed its surprise to see the statement of Dimapur Municipal Council Employees Welfare Union requesting state government to allow DMC to collect urban utility fee or entry fee from all commercial vehicles entering DMC jurisdiction. NVCO, further requested the state government to issue a similar order banning illegal deduction of public funds especially meant for development in a form of commission or percentage, party fund which seriously affects the quality of work undertaken by contractors.



State National Health Mission Director Dr. Akuo Sorhie has described community mobilizers as forerunners between community and health services. She was addressing a three-day training of Trainers of District Community Mobilisers, and Block ASHA Coordinators, on Expanded Packages of Services under Comprehensive Primary Health Care, CPHC which began today at Ayushman Bharat Health & Wellness Center, Kohima. The director pointed out that with the paradigm shift, health care services envisage towards universal health coverage and to bring health care to all. Therefore, to reach the unreached population, she said ASHAs plays a key role. Sorhie added that their assignment over the years has also widened under CPHC objectives. The director appealed participants to recommit in bringing transformation to Public Health Care Delivery System in our State by grasping maximum knowledge out of the training. National Health Mission, State Program Officer, Dr Mereninla Senlem, said the concept of National Health Policy of Universal Health Coverage is all about delivering health care services at the doorstep of the people. She added that 80 percent of deaths and disease burden are now shifted to noncommunicable diseases. Deputy Director, NHM, Dr Manyau Phom, said that the trainers are responsible of further train more than 2,000 ASHAs in the State. During the training, participants will be trained on additional extended packages of Non-Communicable Diseases, Oral health, ENT, Eye, Elderly Care, Palliatives Care, Mental Health, Emergency care like Burns, Trauma and Accident.



Chief Minister Neiphiu Rio has expressed sadness on the demise of Zelul Sophie, father of Kevipodi Sophie, MLA, 14 Southern Angami - I Assembly Constituency who passed away at Kohima today. In a condolence message, Chief Minister said Zelul, worked under the Government of British India as 'ardali' during the pre-independence in the 1940s and later served as a deacon at Jakhama Baptist Church. Rio described Zelul as a man of few words, who was always firm on his decision, besides, a loving and caring father who nurtured his children to be kind and honest. In his demise, the family as well as Jakhama village have lost a pillar, the Chief Minister added. Rio also urged all to thank God for his fulfilled life and cherish wonderful memories left by him. The Chief Minister said in this hour of bereavement, his family joins him in conveying their deepest condolences to the bereaved family members.
