The first conference of North East State Commissioners for Persons with Disabilities was held at Noune Resort in Chümoukedima district of Nagaland where officials from four northeastern states attended the programme. The objective of the conference was to take stock of the implementation status of the - Rights of Persons with Disabilities (RPwD) Act, 2016 Act in the NE region, exchange of information, addressing regional challenges and policy development and advocacy. Nagaland Advisor for Department of Social Welfare, Nagaland Wangpang Konyak said the state government is fully committed to implementing all the provisions of the RPwD Act and ensuring equal opportunities for all citizens with disabilities. He said that though there is still a lot of work to be done, we are making steady progress and this has been largely due

to the strong role played by the Disability Commissioner's office. State Commissioner for Persons with Disability Diethono Nakhro said that through this conference, Commissioners from the region can collectively identify policy gaps, areas of improvement, and needed amendments in the implementation of the Act. She said that by consolidating their knowledge and experiences, they can advocate for necessary changes at the regional and national levels, strengthening the overall framework for disability rights. She called on officials in the disability sector to advocate for systemic change and inspire a more inclusive society. The one-day conference was attended by officials from Assam, Sikkim, Meghalaya, and Tripura.

Campaigning for the sixth phase of Lok Sabha elections ended today. Altogether 58 constituencies spread over eight states and union territories will go to polls in this phase on May 25. These include 8 seats in Bihar, all 10 seats in Haryana, one seat in Jammu and Kashmir, 4 in Jharkhand, all 7 seats in Delhi, 6 in Odisha, 14 in Uttar Pradesh and 8 in West Bengal. As many as 889 candidates are in the fray from these 58 Lok Sabha constituencies. The voting will begin at 7 am and end at 6 pm.

Nagaland Pollution Control Board, NPCB in collaboration with Kiphire Town Council (KTC) organised a workshop cum awareness programme with colony leaders, chairman, gaonburas, sanitation committee members, students' and women organisations and Chamber of Commerce at DC's Conference Hall, Kiphire yesterday. During the programme, Senior Scientific Assistant, NPCB, Olivia G Chophy shared on Ambient Air Quality while Junior Scientific Assistant, NPCB Rongsenben Longkumer shared on Plastic Waste Management.

A one-day seminar on New Subsidy Policy and GST Compliance organized by the Department of Industries and Commerce was held in Dimapur today. Commissioner of Taxes, Nagaland, Sachin Jaiswal has informed that the Department of State Taxes has authorized the Commercial State Tax Officers (CSTOs) in the State to conduct a Survey on GST Compliance Assessment by all the businesses in the State and collect queries & feedbacks from them. Therefore, all the esteemed businesses have been requested to extent cooperation and provide the necessary information and feedbacks to the CSTO to enable them to complete the exercise by 30th of next month.

The Additional Deputy Commissioner cum Administrator of Chozuba Town Council, CTC has informed all the household, institutions, offices and commercial establishment under Chozuba Town to store all plastic waste separately with immediate effect till 1st June. Informing that this is as per the directive from the Department of Urban Development, Swachh Bharat Mission (Urban), he Administrator asked all concerned to strictly comply with the order as the plastic waste would be collected by the CTC on June 1.
