The Executive Engineer stated that it has come to notice that there are such cases in some colonies of Mon Town where illegal usage of poles for hanging of OFC cable are occurring without the permission for usage of electric poles from the undersigned department. He said that handling of electricity related materials is hazardous without proper technical knowledge and skill. He has directed telecom companies to immediately coordination with the department to remove the telecom cables from the

poles. He said the defaulting telecom company would be held responsible for any injuries or technical accidents that may occur due to tilting, bending or damage of poles.

A one-day awareness campaign was held to commemorate World No Tobacco Day yesterday at two Government Schools under Pungro sub-division of Kiphire district in Nagaland.
