BIO:

The Meghalaya Biodiversity Board yesterday observed the International Day for Biological Diversity on the theme "Be Part of the Plan" at U Soso Tham Auditorium, State Central Library, Shillong. The World Biodiversity Day is observed to promote biodiversity conservation and increase understanding and awareness on biodiversity. Speaking on the occasion, Chief Secretary to the Government of Meghalaya, D.P Wahlang said biodiversity is fundamental in sustaining life on earth. It provides air to breathe, water to drink and food to eat, he said and emphasized on the importance of conservation.

HYC:

The leaders Hynniewtrep Youth Council (HYC) met West Khasi Hills Deputy Commissioner Garod LSN Dykes and superintendent of police BD Marak yesterday to address the escalating issue of drugs and other anti-social activities in the district. The discussions revolved around strategies to combat drugs problem and other social issues in Nongstoin. They urged the Deputy Commissioner to instruct the office of the Syiem Hima Nongstoin to take necessary action, particularly regarding the utilization of unused shops and houses in Nongstoin market, which have become temporary shelters for criminals. The HYC proposed the establishment of a Rehabilitation Center in Nongstoin to assist the drug addicts. In their discussion with the Superintendent of Police, the NGO emphasized the need to strengthen the Anti-Narcotic Task Force.

TRIPURA:

The Tripura government is set to undertake a major cleaning drive in Rudrasagar Lake to restore boat service in Sepahijala district to attract tourists. The sparkling lake has been engulfed by water hyacinths causing the suspension of boat rides on the wetland, a Ramsar site. Hundreds of

boatmen who used to carry tourists on their boats have lost their livelihood because of the situation.

BRIDGE:

In Arunachal Pradesh, three foot suspension bridges over Siang River were damaged due to heavy rainfall accompanied by hailstorm in Upper Siang District. The damaged suspension bridges are at Mayum, Zido and Singging villages under Tuting subdivision. This has impacted the daily communication of villagers who use the bridges in their day-to-day life. Ration supply for army personnel stationed at Mayum has also been affected. Power supply in the district, including headquarter Yingkiong, has been hit by hailstorms. The department of power is working for early restoration of electricity in the area.

HEALTH:

The office of the District Medical and Health Officer, South Garo Hills, Meghalaya organised a Mental Health Awareness programme at Baghmara yesterday. Deputy Commissioner of South Garo Hills District, S Awasthi emphasized on the importance of addressing stigma around mental illness as it is widely prevalent in the younger community. The lack of knowledge about mental illness poses a challenge to health care, he said. The DC informed about helpline number 14410 in the South Garo Hills District, over which counselling regarding mental health can be availed by the general public.

FILM:

Meghalaya will draft a comprehensive 'Film Policy' to facilitate the distribution of films at the state, national, and international levels. The policy is also aimed at promoting the growth of the film industry in the state and develop film culture among citizens through forming of Film Clubs in schools and colleges. This was stated by the commissioner and secretary, information and public relations department, Vijay Kumar Mantri during a meeting with prominent filmmakers of Meghalaya yesterday. This policy will support local filmmakers and also attract filmmakers from outside the state by providing facilities for shooting and opportunities for local artists to participate in their projects.

BUDDHA:

Buddha Poornima, marking the advent of Tathagata Buddha, the enlightened one, is being celebrated today. People are visiting the Buddha vihars to pay obeisance to Gautama Buddha.
