Voting for the fifth phase of Lok Sabha elections has begun this morning. Forty-nine constituencies spread over six States and two Union Territories are being covered under this phase. 14 seats of Uttar Pradesh, 13 seats of Maharashtra, seven seats of West Bengal, five seats each of Odisha and Bihar, three seats of Jharkhand and one seat each in Jammu and Kashmir and Ladakh are on polls in this phase. Voting began at 7 this morning and will end at 6 PM. The prominent candidates whose fate will be decided in this phase include BJP leaders and Union Ministers Rajnath Singh, Piyush Goyal, Smriti Irani, Congress leaders Rahul Gandhi and KL Sharma, Omar Abdullah of the National Conference, and Chirag Paswan of LJP (Ram Vilas). Simultaneously, polling is also taking place in 35 Assembly Constituencies of the Odisha Legislative Assembly today.

Two individuals identified as Neizosetuo Kire of 24 years old and Khrietsonyü Whuorie of 25 years have been arrested by Kohima Police in connection to May 18 physical assault made on an elderly man who succumbed to his injuries. A release from PRO Kohima stated that a report was received in North Police Station on May 18 evening that an elderly person has been hospitalized in a private hospital following a physical assault by some individuals in the aftermath of a vehicular traffic related scuffle. The victim was identified as Kezhalelie Lawrence who subsequently succumbed to his injuries. In this regard, a criminal case has been registered in North Police Station under the relevant IPC and further the two accused have been arrested. It may be mentioned

that the deceased was the PA to Deputy Commissioner Kohima and also the present President of the Mezoma Mechü Kehou.

Western Angami Youth Organisation (WAYO) is holding a public rally today to protest against the alleged murder of Kezhalelie Lawrence Miasalhou, personal assistant to Kohima deputy commissioner by two youth Neizosetuo Kire and Khrietsonyü Whuorie of Kohima village. In a press note, the WAYO appealed all Western Angami citizens to join the public rally which will begin from Paramedical junction at 10 am and proceed to the DC's office for submission of a memorandum.
