Nagaland State Election Commissioner, T John Longkumer has informed to conduct elections to the Municipal and Town Councils in the State in a free and fair manner. The Commissioner said that other than what is explicitly laid down in the Nagaland Municipal Act 2023, Rules or instructions and directions issued from time to time by the Commission, any violation or deviation is unlawful and is liable to penal action as per relevant provisions of the law. The Commissioner directed the Deputy Commissioners and the Returning Officers are to ensure that the conduct of elections to the Municipal and Town Councils in the respective districts operate within the laid down provisions of the Nagaland Municipal Act 2023, the Nagaland Municipal Election Rules 2023 and under relevant guidelines from that the Commission. Further, DCs and ROs have been directed to ensure that no extra-statutory rules and regulations made by any groups, associations or municipality Wards deprives the rights and eligibility of eligible ward residents to vote.



Campaigning for Lok Sabha elections is in full swing. Voting in the fourth phase will take place on the 13th of this month in 96 seats spread across ten states and a union territory. As many as One Thousand 717 candidates are in the fray for this phase. In Telangana, electioneering reached its peak in the state with only three days remaining for the campaigning before the May 13 polling. Top leaders of all major parties are making a beeline seeking support from the electors for their candidates. BJP Senior Leader and Union Minister, Amit Shah took part is campaigning in Bhongir Lok Sabha Constituency today in support of party candidate Dr Boora Narsaiah Goud. Congress leader Rahul Gandhi took part in electioneering in Telangana. BRS Chief and former Chief Minister K Chandrasekhar Rao held a roadshow at Karimnagar.



Today is the last date of withdrawal of candidature for the sixth phase of the Lok Sabha polls. A total of 58 Parliamentary Constituencies in six States and two Union Territories will go to poll in this phase on the 25th of this month. All seven seats of Delhi, all ten seats of Haryana, fourteen seats of Uttar Pradesh, eight seats each of Bihar and West Bengal, six seats of Odisha, four seats of Jharkhand and one seat of Jammu and Kashmir will go to polls in this phase. The counting of votes for all the phases will take place on the 4th of next month.

President Droupadi Murmu will present the Padma Awards at the second civil investiture ceremony at Rashtrapati Bhavan in Delhi a short while ago. Padma Awards – one of the highest civilian awards in the country are conferred in three categories – Padma Vibhushan, Padma Bhushan and Padma Shri. The awards are given in various disciplines and fields of activity, including art, social work, public affairs, science and engineering, trade and industry, medicine, literature and education, sports, and civil service. The awards are announced on the occasion of Republic Day every year.

Wokha District sports council led by the District Sports officer Libemo Jami distributed sports kits to Spring Dale School Wokha, yesterday. The distribution was part of the ongoing distributing of sports kits to various schools in Wokha which started from the first week of May. During the programme, Jami encouraged the students to take active part in sports. He said that the purpose of the program is to uncover and nurture young talent from the

district where potential talent often goes unnoticed. The District Sports Officer further announced plans for follow-up visits to provide further training and support.

In Kiphire district, hailstorm accompanied by rainfall yesterday caused large scale destruction of crop ruining lives of farmers at Singrip village. Storm and heavy downpour destroyed multiple Jhum fileds of more than 20 farming families directly affecting their main livelihood. The district disaster management authority is overseeing of the incident and grievances of the effected families. Meanwhile, Singrip village has demanded compensation from the government stating that they are also yet to receive compensation for the crop damaged by heavy rainfall in 2022.

In Mon district, violent storm yesterday damaged Shangnyu Village Government High School building which was constructed under Rashtriya Madhyamik Shiksha Abhiyan. Shangnyu Students' Union President, Nahpoh said that there was no casualty but the school building was destroyed. The students' union has asked Mon district administration to immediately conduct verification of the damages and take action for repairing the school in the greater interest of the students.

Nagaland Board of School Education, has directed all heads of institutions registered under the board to conduct random frisking at schools to electronic Cigarettes and similar devices. The Government of India has prohibited electronic Cigarettes and like devices vide Prohibition of Electronic Cigarettes (Production, Manufacture, Import, Export, Transport, Sales, Distribution, Storage and Advertisement) Act, 2019 in the interest of public health. Ecigarettes is a major threat to health, particularly among young children. In this regard, all registered schools under NBSE are requested to inform and issue necessary instructions to their students to refrain from using such products.



Kohima Law College today launched a seven day long intensive course as part of Practical Papers for final year LLB students. As part of the programme, students will be attached to DEF Kohima for seven days. The programme was launched in the presence of teacher-in-charged Assistant Professor Kezhokhoto Savi, Additional Director General of Police (Law and Order) Sandeep Madhukar Tamgadge and Kohima Superintendent of Police, Bharat Laxman Markad. IGP Tamgadge who also holds a Master Degree in Law briefed the students on Criminal Justice System. Kohima SP Bharat Laxman gave a briefing on the whole concept of the seven day course which designed for students.



Nagaland Directorate of Technical Education has notified that some diploma seats are lying vacant under the State run polytechnics during the current session 2024-25. Interested candidates have been invited to come to the Directorate of Technical Education, Kohima for spot admission on or before 17th May 2024. It also informed that the admission against those limited seats will be done on the basis of first come first serve.

The Indian Council of Medical Research has released upgraded Dietary Guidelines for Indians to suit modern eating habits for 2024.
