The first set of citizenship certificates after notification of Citizenship Amendment Rules 2024 were issued today. Union Home Secretary Ajay Kumar Bhalla handed over citizenship certificates to 14 applicants in New Delhi who were granted citizenship. Home Secretary highlighted salient features of the Citizenship Amendment Rules which was notified on 11th March 2024. Under the rules, applications were received from persons belonging to Hindu, Sikh, Jain, Buddhist, Parsi and Christian communities from Pakistan, Bangladesh and Afghanistan who have entered into India up to 31st December, 2014.



An orientation on National Quality Assurance Standard, NQAS for Medical Officers, Community Health Officers and Staff Nurses was held today in Kohima. Principal Director, Department of Health and Family Welfare Dr E Motsuthung Patton said that it is a privilege for healthcare providers to serve people especially in interior parts of the state. He called them to work relentlessly to improve health indicators and to provide quality health care. National Health Mission Director, Dr. Akuo Sorhie said that NQAS is the

highest quality certification for public health facility. Dr Akuo mentioned that the main focus of NQAS is to enhance satisfaction level of patients who seek public facilities and to rebuild trust in Public Health system. He urged participant to strive to make the Health Units within their jurisdiction NQAS certified Health Units. NHM State Program Officer Dr. Mereninla Senlem, said the National Health Policy 2017 aims at Universal Health coverage for all and will be achieved only when healthcare providers give excellent, safe and quality health care. She added NQAS Certification is a key indicator not only for Niti Aayog ranking but also for aspirational blocks. In Nagaland, so far, three Urban Primary Health Units and two Primary Health Units have achieved NQAS Certification. According to Government of India, it is mandatory for the State to achieve 50 percent of Public Health NQAS certification by 2025 and 100 percent by December 2026.



Administrator and Returning Officer of Kohima Municipal Council T Lanusenla Longkumer today said that it is anticipating potentially intensive situations in some areas for the upcoming ULB election. She was addressing the monthly District Planning and Development Board in Kohima today and informed that the ULB Election is set to involve 107 polling stations across 19 wards with over fifty thousand voters. She highlighted that Ballot Boxes will be used instead of EVMs. Longkumer also emphasized on the importance of training and awareness on Ballot Box voting. Under Village Adoption Committees, 10 Northern Angami I was awarded best performing VAC and 11 Northern Angami II secured second place out of six VACs in Kohima. Meanwhile, Deputy Commissioner and DPDB Vice Chairman, Kumar Ramnikant while chairing the meeting called for support for upcoming Lok Sabha polls counting day and ULB elections. He reminded attendees that Model Code of Conduct remains in effect until the completion of ULB elections.



Indian Air Force has tested BHISHM Cube, a state-of the-art indigenous mobile hospital, for airdrop in Agra. Union Health Minister Mansukh Mandaviya said, this innovative technology is a great leap forward in providing rapid and comprehensive medical aid during emergencies anywhere. This cube is a part of the broader initiative named Project BHISHM- Bharat Health Initiative for Sahyog, Hita and Maitri, is tailored to treat up to 200 casualties.

Government Higher Secondary School Tuensang today held interactive session with Chubalemba B Chang, who secured All India Rank 915 in the 2023 UPSC examination. Chang who is an alumnus of the school, spoke about his Civil services journey. He remarked that he faced numerous failures. Chang recalled that he faced financial constraints which prevented him from studying outside the town after matriculation. He urged the students to persevere and advised not to fall into bad habits like substance abuse and utilize mobile phones judiciously. Chang also told students not to undermine any subject but put equal importance to all subjects. Vice Principal Apenro Khuvung said that the school is committed to nurturing students. Khuvung said that the students need role models to encourage them to dream bigger.



Electronics and IT Secretary, S. Krishnan today said that the 6G technology has the potential to strengthen the nation's digital economy and enhance productivity. He further highlighted that 6G will lead to large data generation and it will provide better input for Artificial Intelligence to learn and smarten itself. Krishnan urged the industry leaders at the conference to collaborate for a better digital infrastructure.

For the first time India is hosting a Bharat Parv at the Cannes Film Festival. The Bharat Pavilion at Cannes will serve as a platform for the Indian film community to engage in various activities. This includes fostering production collaborations, curated knowledge sessions, signing distribution deals, business to business meetings and networking with prominent entertainment and media players from around the world. The Bharat Pavilion has been designed by the National Institute of Design, Ahmedabad is christened on - The Sutradhara for depicting this year's theme of Create in India.



Chief Electoral Officer, Nagaland, Vyasan R visited Phek today and inspected EVM strong rooms and counting hall for Lok Sabha Election at DC and DEO office Phek.
