Prime Minister and senior BJP leader Narendra Modi said that the country has decided to form a BJP-NDA government for the third time because of its good intentions and policies. The country has understood that the INDI alliance is communal and casteist, PM Modi said this while addressing a public meeting in Mirzapur today. He claimed that Samajwadi party and Congress people are dedicated to vote bank, whereas, he is dedicated to the poor, dalits and backward people of the country. Targeting Samajwadi party, PM Modi said that law and order and the Samajwadi Party are opposite to each other. The Prime Minister further said, Samajwadi Party government used to look forward to the mafias as a part of the vote bank but under the Yogi Government, action is being taken against the mafias.



It has been reported that fraudsters are making international spoofed calls displaying Indian mobile numbers to Indian citizens and committing cyber-crime and financial frauds. These calls appear to be originating within India but being made by cyber-criminals from abroad by manipulating the Calling Line Identity. Such international spoofed calls have been misused in recent cases of fake digital arrests, FedEx scams, drugs in courier, impersonation as government and police officials, disconnections of mobile numbers by Department of Telecommunications (DoT) or TRAI officials, etc. Therefore, DoT and Telecom Service Providers (TSPs) have devised a system to identify and block such incoming international spoofed calls from reaching any Indian telecom subscriber. Directions have been issued to TSPs for blocking of such incoming international spoofed calls. Incoming international spoofed calls with Indian landline numbers are being already blocked by the TSPs as per directions issued by DoT. Despite best efforts, there may still be some fraudsters who succeed through other means. Public can report such suspected fraud communications at Chakshu facility on Sanchar Saathi portal.



Wokha Police has arrested two persons in a fraud case. Additional SP and PRO DEF Wokha Soriso K Quinker stated the accused persons arrested on May 20 has been identified as Lochumbeni M. Erui and Thundemo K. Murry. Police said they were accused of embezzling an amount of 14 lakh 62 thousand and 500 rupees from bank account of DBHSS Wokha, which was maintaining its account since 2013 for the purpose of collecting fees. Police said that Erui was serving as the cashier and Murry was an assistant sales manager at Axis Bank, Wokha but resigned after the incident. Police said, the complaint was received from Branch Head, Axis Bank Gaijinlung Kamai. As per preliminary enquiry, police said it was ascertained that the duo were involved in embezzling bank money without the knowledge of their authority. On further enquiry, it was also ascertained that they have also given a confession letter to the erstwhile Bank Head Kahuto Achumi regarding their involvement in school fee embezzlement. Based on the findings, a case has been

registered against the accused at Wokha PS under relevant sections of law.



Realizing the importance of oral health, the Department of Youth Resources and Sports in association with Nagaland Institute of Science and Technology and Kekhro Smile Foundation today conducted oral health camp cum awareness program for student athletes of Indira Gandhi Stadium (IGS) Kohima. During the event, special guest, Director of Youth Resources and Sports, Kethosituo Sekhose said the IGS Kohima academy have over 140 athletes students who are studying in schools and colleges and during a recent screening, many students were found to have dental health problem and in this regard, the event was necessitated. Sekhose also underscored the importance of oral health and told the students to take care of their dental health. On the occasion, Founding Member Kekhro Smile Foundation, Dr Pfukrolo Koza gave awareness on oral health which forms an essential part of human beings to be healthy. He emphasized the importance of oral hygiene stating that prevention is always better than cure. While he also clarified the myths surfacing in dentistry by informing that vision is not affected by treatment or extraction of any tooth. Koza added that infected teeth left untreated can spread the infection to other parts of the body and stressed the need to take care of health.



The Appointments Committee of Cabinet, today approved the extension in service of Chief of the Army Staff (COAS) General Manoj C Pande, for a period of one month, beyond his normal age of superannuation (May 31, 2024), up to June 30, 2024, under Rule 16 A (4) of the Army Rules 1954. He was appointed as the COAS on April 30, 2022. He was commissioned in December 1982 in the Corps of Engineers (The Bombay Sappers). He held the appointment of Vice Chief of the Army Staff before taking over as the COAS.

Kapadia’s film competed alongside works by world-renowned directors. The jury was presided over by Greta Gerwig, director of ‘Ladybird’ and ‘Barbie’. All We Imagine As Light’, an Indo-French production, tells the story of a nurse named Prabha who receives an unexpected gift from her estranged husband, causing disruption in her life.



West Bengal Government is taking comprehensive relief and rehabilitation measures in view of Cyclone Remal, which is expected to make a landfall between Khepupara in Bangladesh and Sagar Islands in West Bengal midnight of tonight as severe cyclonic storm. A special control room has been set up in the state secretariat, Nabanna. An 'Integrated Control Room' has also started working in Kolkata police headquarters to deal with possible disaster. Kolkata Airport authorities have decided to suspend flight operations for 21 hours from today noon in view of possible impact of the cyclone. Meanwhile, Indian Navy has also initiated preparatory actions to provide immediate and effective assistance in the wake of Cyclone Remal. It has readied

two ships equipped with humanitarian assistance, disaster relief response and medical supplies for immediate deployment to ensure safety and welfare of affected populace.
