Union Minister of State (Independent Charge) for the Ministry of Law and Justice, Arjun Ram Meghwal said that Union Government replaced the colonial era criminal justice system to provide justice to people in a time bound manner. Speaking at the inaugural session of second Conference titled India's Progressive Path in the Administration of Criminal Justice System, at IIT Guwahati yesterday, Meghwal, pointed out that the colonial criminal justice system lacked Indian spirit and ethos. The Minister said that the new laws, Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita, 2023; Bharatiya Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita, 2023 and the Bharatiya Sakshya Adhiniyam 2023 are people centric and the Union Government adopted these news laws in right time as India is developing in fast pace. These three new laws will replace the Indian Penal Code 1860, the Code of Criminal Procedure, 1973 and the Indian Evidence Act, 1872, with effect from 1st July, 2024.



Prime Minister and Senior BJP leader, Narendra Modi said that the 2024 General Elections are crucial to defeat the mindset of nepotism and forces that want to weaken India. Addressing a public meeting in North East Delhi yesterday, he said Indian polity needs a stable government. Emphasizing that the national capital must become an attraction for the world, he said global leaders were awestruck by the transformation of Delhi during the G20 Summit. Modi accused that the INDI alliance is hell-bent on creating hindrances to development works. Meanwhile, Senior Congress leader Rahul Gandhi said the first aim of INDIA Alliance is to save the Constitution. Addressing a rally at

Ramlila Maidan in New Delhi, Gandhi alleged that the ruling party wants to weaken the Constitution. He accused that Narendra Modi government did nothing for small businessmen but gave 16 lakh crore rupees to certain industrialists. Gandhi attacked BJP on the issue of electoral bonds and unemployment.



Polling for the fifth phase of election to the Lok Sabha will be held tomorrow in 49 constituencies in six states and two Union Territories. Simultaneously, second phase polling of Odisha Legislative Election will also be held for 35 Assembly seats. Campaigning for the fifth phase of Lok Sabha Elections came to an end last evening. Political heavyweights were on a marathon election tour to cover maximum constituencies to garner support for their party candidates. Meanwhile, campaigning for the remaining phases has intensified.
