#### **SIKKIM**

Sikkim Governor, Lakshman Prasad Acharya, who also serves as the Chief Rector of the Sikkim Central University, visited the permanent campus of the university at Yangang in Namchi District. During the visit, the Governor expressed his pleasure over the establishment of the permanent campus at Yangang. Dwelling upon the significance of the new campus, the Governor remarked on the positivity it embodies, stressing that responsibility would enhance the University's rankings. ## MANIPUR

Manipur Chief Minister, N. Biren Singh said that five thousand four hundred fifty-seven illegal immigrants were found to have settled in Manipur. In a social media post, the Chief Minister said, the Government has initiated taking biometrics of these illegal immigrants. He said that till the 7<sup>th</sup> of this month, these illegal immigrants have been found settling in Kamjong district of Manipur which shares a porous border with Myanmar. The Government has decided to deport these immigrants to their country. Meanwhile, the Chief Minister visited the villages affected by hail storm accompanied by thunderstorm and rainfall last Sunday. He also visited the special relief camps opened for those families affected by the natural calamity. Singh said that fifteen thousand eight hundred houses have been damaged. The compensation to the affected families will be disbursed through the concerned MLAs very soon.

#### **PRE-MONSOON**

In Sikkim, District Collector of Pakyong, Tashi Chophel, led a meeting on pre-monsoon readiness in the state. The meeting aimed to strategize for the upcoming monsoon season, focusing on coordination among the departments. Attendees included senior officials from various agencies and departments. The meeting addressed preparedness, highlighted areas needing improvement, and collaborative planning to ensure safety and minimize the damage. Discussions emphasized clearing high-risk areas, managing emergencies effectively, and protecting public health. The Senior SP and others emphasized enhancing emergency services and coordinating actions to manage disasters efficiently.

# **RESULTS**

In Meghalaya, Laban Bengalee Boys' Higher Secondary School, Shillong and St Mary's Higher Secondary School, Shillong secured the top positions in science and commerce streams of this year's Higher Secondary School Leaving Certificate examinations, the results of which were declared yesterday. Sohan Bhattacharjee of Laban Bengalee Boys' Higher Secondary School secured the top position in the Science stream with a total of 483 marks and letters in English, physics, chemistry, mathematics, alternative english and computer science. In the Commerce stream, Ferry Filarisha Wann of St Mary's Higher Secondary School secured the first position with a total marks 472 marks and letters in English, Khasi, economics, accountancy, mathematics and business studies. The overall pass percentage in this year's HSSLC (Science) examination is 85.24% while the overall pass percentage in HSSLC (Commerce) is 80.26%.
