President Droupadi Murmu today said that Jammu and Kashmir has given a befitting reply to India's enemies as the Union Territory registered record voter turnout in the recently concluded Lok Sabha polls. She said that decades long records of voting have been broken in J&K. In her address to the joint sitting of the Parliament, the President said that for the past four decades, Kashmir witnessed low voting amid shutdowns and strikes and the country's enemies propagated it as the opinion of Kashmir on international forums. But this time, Kashmir valley has given a befitting reply to all such forces. In her address, the President said that in ten years, the country has risen from the 11th position to become the fifth largest economy.

The Central Bureau of Investigation arrested two persons in connection with the alleged irregularities in the NEET-UG exam. Official sources said that the two accused had been arrested from Patna in Bihar. The CBI, which formally took over the investigation into the NEET-UG paper leak case, visited the office of the Economic Offences Unit of Bihar Police on Monday and started an investigation in this regard.

Chief Minister Pema Khandu's mother Leki Zangmu died yesterday afternoon at Tomo Riba Institute of Health and Medical Sciences, Naharlagun after prolonged illness. She was around 75 years old. She is survived by two sons and eight grandchildren and two daughters-in-law. Her husband, the late Chief Minister Dorjee Khandu had passed away in 2011. Her body is taken away to Tawang for the final rituals today morning from the residence of the Chief Minister.

Govt. of Arunachal Pradesh has approved the Detailed Project Report of Rs. 133.17 crore for 167 villages under Vibrant Villages Programme. In the 3rd meeting of the Distribution Reforms Committee for Revamped Distribution Sector Scheme (RDSS) under Vibrant Villages Programme today, the Committee recommended and approved the DPR Extension of electricity distribution infrastructure in the state. The DPR will be placed in the upcoming

State Cabinet meeting for accord of sanction. The meeting was chaired by Chief Secretary Shri Dharmendra.

National Medical Commission's Medical Assessment & Rating Board has increased the MBBS seats of Tomo Riba Institute of Health & Medical Sciences, Naharlagun from existing 50 seats to 100 seats. The board in a letter to the principal of TRIHMS informed that the board has considered their application to increase the MBBS seats for the academic year 2024-2025, subject to verification of Bank Guarantee.

Altogether 15 students of class 8 were assaulted allegedly by their seniors in Bordumsa's Jawahar Novodaya Vidyalaya hostel. The school authorities suspended five senior students of class XI allegedly involved in the incident that took place on Tuesday, principal Rajeev Ranjan said. A police complaint has also been lodged in connection with the incident. The injured students were taken to a hospital. Principal Rajeev Ranjan convened a disciplinary action committee meeting and found five senior students guilty of inflicting physical harm and psychological trauma on class 8 students.

Meteorological Centre Itanagar has said that a very intense rain spell over Itanagar and Mebo area of Arunachal Pradesh due to the Cyclonic Circulation. Under its influence widespread rainfall activity with isolated heavy rainfall and thunderstorm lightning is very likely to occur over PAPUM PARE district. Meteorological Centre Itanagar also said that Itanagar and Mebo in East Siang had witnessed 52mm and 62mm rainfall respectively in the first half today. Meteorological Centre Itanagar also predicted moderate flash flood risk in Papumpare, East Siang, Lepa Reda and Lower Dibang Valley district till tomorrow morning.

South Africa defeated Afghanistan by nine wickets in their T20 World Cup 2024 semi-final today. Courtesy of their win, South Africa also reached their maiden World Cup final. In the second semi-final match of the ICC Men's T20 World Cup, India will lock horns with England at Providence Stadium in Guyana today. The match will begin at 8 PM, IST today.
