The India Meteorological Department (IMD) today issued a Red Alert for Papum Pare district and has predicted heavy rain with thunderstorm and lightning over the next 24hrs. It has also issued Orange alerts for 8 districts and Yellow alerts for 10 districts. IMD forecasts heavy to very heavy rainfall in the state over the next five days. It has also warned of thunderstorms with lightning and extremely heavy rains likely in isolated places. Meanwhile, a portion of the NH-415 has been washed away by flash flood at Karsingsa area yesterday thereby completely halting the vehicular movement along Nirjuli-Banderdewa stretch of the highway. In view of this, the Itanagar Capital District administration has ordered closure of the highway from Nirjuli to Banderdewa and diversion of traffic through Gumto road for the period till restoration of the road. During the said period all vehicles movement shall be restricted, the DA informed.

Vice President Jagdeep Dhankhar said that tribal society has a huge contribution in India's economy and is our identity. Mr Dhankhar was addressing a program organized on the occasion of World Sickle Cell Elimination Day in Dindori, Madhya Pradesh today. The Vice President said that the government is committed to the elimination of sickle cell disease.
