After 20 years, Congress makes a comeback in Nagaland by winning the state lone Lok Sabha seat. S Supongmeren Jamir defeated Dr. Chumben Murry of the Nationalist Democratic Progressive Party (NDPP) by a margin 50 thousand, 984 votes. Speaking to the media after winning, Jamir said as promised in the party's manifesto, he will work with committed for the People. Stating that win is a turning point for Congress party, he said he will go down to the grassroot people and deliver justice

and confidence to them. Emphasizing that this victory clearly show that the people wanted a change, Jamir assured that the congress party will work towards the development and interest of the people. The Food Safety and Standards Authority of India (FSSAI) has issued a directive mandating all Food Business Operators (FBOs) to remove any claim of 100 percent fruit juices from the labels and advertisements of reconstituted fruit juices with an immediate effect. It has also instructed all FBOs to exhaust all existing pre-printed packaging materials before 1st September 2024. Ministry of Health and Family Welfare in a statement said that it has come to the attention of FSSAI that several FBOs have been inaccurately marketing various types of reconstituted fruit juices by claiming them to be 100 percent. FSSAI has also said that according to the Food Safety and Standards (Advertising and Claims) Regulations, there is no provision for making a 100 percent claim. The Ministry asked

FBOs to comply with the standards for fruit juices under the Food Safety and Standards Regulation.

Member Secretary, Nagaland Pollution Board & State Nodal Officer for Clean Air Program (NCAP), K. Hukato Chishi urged for creating more public gardens and water fountains in residential areas. Inaugurating a Water Fountain at Traffic Intersection Landmark Colony in Dimapur district, Hukato said good air quality bring health benefits for the people. He also pointed out that the air quality in Dimapur and Kohima did not meet the standards set by the Central Pollution Control Board. Hukato added that bad air quality can have serious impact on health, as dry air can cause respiratory problems. Executive Engineer, PHED Urban Division Dimapur, Bendangtola Walling, while presenting the Technical Report said that the fountain was constructed by Urban Division Public Health Education, Dimapur and funded by NCAP, a Program launched by Ministry of Environment, Forest and Climate Change to improved air quality at the city, regional and national level. Walling said, the main objective of construction of water fountain on the roadside was to minimize and reduce Dust Pollution created on the roadside and for beautification of the city.

A one-day state level workshop on Research Methodology and Research Publication in SCOPUS and UGC-CARE Listed Journals was held yesterday at Dimapur Government College, DGC. The workshop was organized by the Research and Development Cell and Internal Quality Assurance Cell of Dimapur Government College where participants

DGC Principal Professor Sanjay Sharma explained the paradigm shift in the educational system under the National Education Policy 2020.

In commemoration of World Environment day, a mass social work will be conducted at Tuensang Town tomorrow from 6:00 am onwards. The social work will be conducted with emphasizes on plastic waste management targeting Single Use of Plastic (SUP). Additional Deputy Commissioner of Tuensang, Thungchanbemo Tungoe has directed all head of offices and institutions and wards of Tuensang town to actively participate in the social work. The ward with the highest collection of segregated SUP will be declared as the winner with a cash prize of 5000 rupees.
