Senior BJP MP Om Birla was today elected as the Speaker of the 18th Lok Sabha. He was elected with voice vote as the opposition which fielded Congress MP K. Suresh for the post, did not press for voting in the House. After his election, Prime Minister Leader of Opposition Narendra Modi, Rahul Gandhi and Parliamentary Affairs Minister Kiren Rijiju escorted Mr. Birla to the chair of the Speaker. Earlier, when the House met this morning, Prime Minister Modi and 12 other NDA leaders moved the motions to elect Mr. Birla as the Speaker. Congratulating Mr. Birla on his election, the Prime Minister said, history is being made today with the re-election of Mr. Birla for the second time. He said the house looks forward to his guidance in the next five years. Arunachal Pradesh Chief Minister Pema Khandu in a social media post has also congratulated Mr. Birla on being elected as the Speaker of the Lok Sabha.
