For the purpose of identification of electors during the coming Municipal Council Elections in Nagaland, the and Town State Election Commission, SEC has notified the guidelines to be adopted for identification of the electors by the Presiding Officers. The electors have been informed to carry anyone of the following documents for identification and exercising their franchise - Indian Passport, Driving License, Aadhaar Card, Service Identity Card issued to its employee by the State/Central Government, Public Sector Undertaking, Public Limited Companies, Bank/Post Office Pass Book with photograph, Pan Card, Pension Document with photograph or Indigenous Inhabitant Certificate the Deputy Commissioner or Additional issued by Deputy Commissioner. The Commission clarified that any documents, as mentioned earlier, which are available only for head of family, would be allowed for the purpose of identification of other members of the family. Similarly, it said, any documents in the name of any other member of the family could also be used for identification of other members, provided the other members can be identified on the basis of such documents. The SEC said that Minor discrepancies in the entries relating to elector's name, father's/mother's/husband name, sex, age or address in the electoral roll would be ignored and the elector will be allowed to cast his/her vote so long as the identity of the elector can be established according to the particulars of electors appearing in the electoral roll and

to the satisfaction of the Presiding Officer or Polling Officer. Further, the SEC stated that no elector would be allowed to exercise his/her franchise unless he/she produces any of the documents prescribed by the State Election Commission.
