Nagaland has become the first state in the Northeast region to bring out the report of District Domestic Product (DDP) estimates. The first report on DDP Nagaland published by the Department of Economics & Statistics was released by Advisor IT & Communication, Economics & Statistics and Evaluation Nagaland, H. Sethrongkyu Sangtam today during a one day state level workshop to promote User Producer Interface on Gross State Domestic Product (GSDP) and District Domestic Product (DDP) at Kohima. As per the report, the GSDP at constant price of Nagaland has increased from 12 Thousand 176.74 Crore rupees during 2011-2012 to 18 Thousand 476.79 Crore rupees during 2019-2020. It reported that the structure of Nagaland's economy shows that tertiary sector has emerged as the most robust sector contributing 61.47 percent to the total Gross state value added during 2019-20, followed by primary sector and secondary sector with 27.57 percent and 10.95 percent respectively. While, the per capita income of the state during 2019-2020 was One Thousand 227.59 Crore rupees. Meanwhile, Dimapur district has been

ranked with the largest economy with a Gross District Domestic Product value of Five Thousand 436.11 Crore rupees during 2019-20, whereas Longleng is the district with the smallest economy with a GDDP value of 621.12 Crore rupees. In term of Per Capita Income, Dimapur district is again the highest with a value of One Lakh 94 Thousand 514 rupees followed by Longleng district with a value of One Lakh 54 Thousand rupees whereas Mon district is the lowest amongst the district with the value of 77 Thousand 738 rupees.

A one day state level workshop to promote User Producer Interface on Gross State Domestic Product (GSDP) and District Domestic Product (DDP) under Support for Statistical Strengthening Sub-Scheme was organized by the Department of Economics & Statistics at Kohima today. Speaking at the programme as the special guest, Chief Secretary J Alam said statistical data is of prime importance for the government and the policy makers. He noted how an inaccurate census of the state had a negative impact in all the sectors. The Chief Secretary noted that over the years, the quality of data collected by the Economics & Statistics department has greatly improved. He said the data will address the regional disparity which is a major issue in the state. Alam hoped that the DPP will help in dispelling the wrong perceptions about the economic development of various parts of the state. As per the report, Dimapur has the highest district per capita income and is followed by Longleng, Zunheboto, Peren, Kiphere and Mokokchung. This is followed by Wokha, Kohima, Tuensang and Phek with Mon coming in the last rank. Additional Director General & head of National Accounts Division, Ministry of Statistics & programme Implementation Dr. Prafulla Chandra Mishra said, the state GDP is a very important criteria not only for devolution of funds to the state but also to see how the state has changed and shifted structurally.
