Counting of votes for Lok Sabha elections will begin at 8 AM today. Counting of votes for the assembly polls in Andhra Pradesh and Odisha and bye-elections to assembly constituencies will also be held simultaneously. Chief Election Commissioner Rajiv Kumar said that three layer security of Central Armed Police Forces has been put in place at the counting centres. He said, round the clock CCTV coverage will be done at the counting centres along with micro observers on each counting table. The Election Commission said that the counting trends and results will be available on the ECI Website at results.eci.gov.in as well as on the Voter Helpline App.

In Nagaland, all preparations have been made to ensure smooth counting of votes today. The lone Lok Sabha seat in Nagaland is witnessing a triangular contest between S Supongmeren Jamir of Indian National Congress, Dr Chumben Murry of Nationalist Democratic Progressive Party and Independent candidate Hayithung Tungoe Lotha. Chief Electoral Officer, CEO Nagaland Vyasan R said counting will commence across 17 counting centres - 15 district headquarters, one ADC headquarters (Pughoboto) and Returning Officer office in Commissioner Nagaland office Kohima. He said, the postal ballots will be counted first, at the Returning officer's office Kohima. He said that half-an-hour later, the counting of votes recorded in the EVMs will commence. The CEO informed that there are a total of 61 counting tables for counting EVMs and 12 tables for counting Postal Ballots. The CEO said, the strong rooms will be opened in the presence of the candidates or their agents. In addition, the CEO said the election office will set up mobile vans in different strategic points in Kohima town to display the election results, besides the official website of the Election Commission.

Rising People's Party, RPP has urged Nagaland government to restore the TA/DA rate of one thousand 500 rupees per day for uniformed police personnel on election duty outside the state.
