

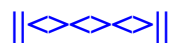

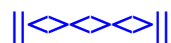

Bangladesh Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina will leave Dhaka for New Delhi tomorrow to attend the swearing-in ceremony of Narendra Modi as the Prime Minister of India for a third consecutive term. Earlier on Wednesday, Prime Minister Narendra Modi invited his Bangladeshi counterpart to attend the swearing-in ceremony of his government during a conversation over the telephone. Modi is likely to take oath on June 8 as the BJP-led NDA scraped past the majority mark to win 293 seats in the 18th Lok Sabha elections while the opposition INDIA bloc, secured 234 seats. Meanwhile, ahead of the Swearing-in ceremony of the Prime Minister, senior officers including Information and Broadcasting Secretary Sanjay Jaju, Prasar Bharati CEO Gaurav Dwivedi, Akashvani DG Maushumi Chakravarty and Doordarshan DG Kanchan Prasad among others, today reviewed the set-up for coverage at the Rashtrapati Bhawan in New Delhi.



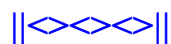
As several newly elected Members of Parliament have started arriving in New Delhi, Lok Sabha Secretariat is ready to welcome Members of the 18th Lok Sabha. In a release, The Secretariat said that several measures have been taken to welcome the Members and ensure their seamless registration. In a view to save time and use paperless digital process, the registration of the newly elected Members shall be done through an online integrated software application. Special arrangements have also been made for simultaneous opening of SBI bank account, issuing of permanent Identity Card, Central Government Health Scheme Card to the newly elected Members on the spot.



Union Health Ministry today held review meeting with States on heat-wave preparedness and measures to prevent hospital fires during summer months. The Directorate General of Health Services, Dr Atul Goel conducted the virtual meeting. During the meeting, it was informed that the highest-level officials of all State and Union Territories are monitoring the situation stringently. They have established an emergency response plan with SOPs for evacuating patients, staff and visitors in the untoward event of a fire.



Deputy Commissioner of Mon, Ajit Kumar Verma has informed public of the district that heavy rainfall is expected during the monsoon period in lowland and foothill areas of Mon District. Verma said, the district is likely to experience inundated water logging, flash floods, landslides and rising water level in the rivers and streams because of heavy precipitation in the hill sector. In this regard, he has advised the people to refrain from going to landslide prone areas and avoid movement and overnight stay beside river banks for picnics, fishing and other water related activities or take shelter under large trees. The DC further advised people to be watchful on hill roads and try to note features like cracks on road surface and slopes and to alert authorities. He has also directed concerned Area Administrative Officers, Village Disaster Management Authorities, Village Council Chairman Goan Buras and Ward Authorities to take precautionary measures and be alert to any emergencies caused by natural calamities to save lives and properties.



MLA, Dr. Sukhato A. Sema has stressed on the need for farmers to adopt cluster farming to promote self-sufficiency and food export. Inaugurating the agri-link road, RKVY power tiller path and waiting shed at Ighanumi, under Pughoboto Sub-division today, Sukhato urged the farmers to mobilize effectively under Mission Organic Value Chain Development and to develop a sense of ownership with respect to all government departments and facilities. Nagaland state Agriculture Department initiated the three prime projects with the vision of a Feasible and economically viable Agriculture by 2030 in the State.



Deputy Commissioner of Chumoukedima district, Abhinav Shivam today said that one must not underestimate what an individual can do to change the society. Inaugurating the Government Higher Secondary School (GHSS), Chumoukedima science laboratory, he called on the students to have big dreams and work hard to achieve it so that they can transformed the society for the betterment of the people. The DC said that it was a matter of shame and embarrassment to learn that the best performing government school of the district and perhaps of Nagaland, did not have a science lab for the students till today. Earlier, in her welcome address, Principal of GHSS, Chumoukedima, Karen Yepthomi expressed gratitude to the DC for taking the initiative in setting up the science laboratory equipped with state-of-the-art infrastructure and required apparatus and chemicals. It may be mentioned that GHSS, Chumoukedima have brought several laurels to the State. Ilanguale A Zeliang, a student of 12 standard Arts stream ranked in the top 5th position in the HSSLC exam 2024. The school also won the first position in the Nagaland Inter District Choir Competition 2024 organized by Samagra Shiksha as well as the 1st position in the district level marathon organized by the National Institute of Solar Energy and Forest Department on World Environment Day 2024.



The Kohima District Disaster Management Authority today organized mass social work across Kohima Town in a an effort to prepare for the upcoming monsoon season. The initiative aimed to clean and clear all clogged drains in the area to ensure the smooth flow of rainwater. The district administration along with Kohima Municipal Council successfully carried out the mass social work in all the wards and colonies. Various government offices and all the 19 wards, including business community took part in the event. The participants,

equipped with necessary tools and items, worked to clear the drains and remove blockages. The departments also provided vehicles and machinery for efficient garbage collection and disposal. Later, the garbage collected during the social work was properly disposed of at the KMC dumping site.



India Meteorological Department has predicted widespread light to moderate rainfall accompanied with thunderstorms and lightning over North East region, Sub-Himalayan West Bengal and Sikkim during the next six days. Meanwhile in Assam, flood situation has improved due to better weather conditions during the last 24 hours with the number of total affected population coming down to over two lakh 46 thousand. One person died in Cachar district taking the season's flood toll to 25.



Advisor for Transport and Technical Education, Temjenmenba today donated a raptor from the hawk family to Kohima Forest Department. The bird was handed over to the officials of the Kohima Forest Division, in the presence of Deputy Conservator of Forests, Kohima, Dr. Sevon Seletsu which was later handed over to the Wildlife Division for its conservation. A press release from the Kohima Forest Division stated that with the depletion of wildlife ecosystem in Nagaland, the Advisor's concern for our environment and its biodiversity by donating a rare species, made an exemplary action.
