MODI:

Mr. Narendra Modi yesterday took charge as Prime Minister for the third time. After assuming the charge, Mr Modi signed the first file authorising release of 17th instalment of PM-Kisan Samman Nidhi. This will benefit nine crore 30 lakh farmers by distributing around twenty thousand crore rupees. Mr Modi said, his first decision of the new government shows commitment of government to farmer welfare. Prime Minister Modi said, his government will keep working even more for the farmers and the agriculture sector in the times to come.

SWORN-IN:

Sikkim Krantikari Morcha President and its Legislature Party Leader Prem Singh Tamang was sworn-in as Chief Minister of the State for the second time at Paljor Stadium of state capital Gangtok yesterday. State Governor Lakshman Prasad Acharya administered him the oath of office and secrecy. In a unique style, chanting of prayers by Buddhist monks, singing hymns by Christian Choir group and vedic chanting by Sanskrit Mahavidyalaya as well as vedic chanting for peace, prosperity, happiness and well-being of the State were also significant features of yesterday's swearing-in ceremony. Mr. Tamang led SKM retained power for its second term with a thumping majority winning 31 seats out of 32 in the Sikkim Legislative Assembly Elections, 2024.

CONDEMN:

The Chief Minister of Manipur, N. Biren Singh condemned the ambush to the advance security team of Chief Minister by armed miscreants along the National Highway 37 yesterday. Mr. Biren said that the ambush to the advance security team is like attacking the Chief Minister of State which represented the people of Manipur and assured that Government will not leave no stone unturned to nab the

armed culprit. Mr. Biren visited the injured driver of Chief Minister advance security team who had sustained bullet injuries and was admitted to a private hospital in Imphal for further treatment. The ambush took place near K. Sinam Village of Kangpokpi district when the Chief Minister advance security team was enroute to Jiribam district. While speaking to media persons in the hospital after visiting the injured police personnel, the Chief Minister said that attack on the State machinery is highly condemnable.

APPROACH:

Mizoram Chief Minister Lalduhoma said that his Government came to power on new approach to governance with inclusive government. Addressing the Ministers and Officials at the Inter – Departmental Meeting in Aizawl yesterday, Pu Lalduhoma said that “Mizoram First” must be the guiding principle of his government. He said that his government will focus upon service delivery to the common man. The Chief Minister said that technological involvement has sped up service delivery and these platforms should strive towards eliminating the long-standing menace of ‘middlemen’. The Chief Minister said that the importance of civil servants in the achievement of the government's objectives cannot be over-emphasized. Quoting Sardar Vallabhbhai Patel, he said that on a smaller scale, the civil servants of Mizoram continue to be the “Steel frame of Mizoram”. Pu Lalduhoma said that transparency and accountability are now inalienable parts of governance.

TEAM:

A central ministerial team headed by an officer of director level from Ministry of Fisheries, Animal Husbandry & Dairying arrived in Manipur to take stock of the damages caused by cyclone and hailstorm occurred in the State last month. A severe hailstorm struck several parts of Manipur on May 5th causing extensive damage to houses, vehicles and crops. The team visited different places of Thoubal yesterday to ascertain the damages caused by the hailstorm. The district administration of Thoubal district also handed over the report which has been compiled from the reports submitted by the hailstorm affected families.

RESIGNATION:

After winning the Lok Sabha election from Tura parliamentary constituency of Meghalaya, the newly elected MP Saleng Sangma yesterday resigned as Gambegre MLA. He submitted his resignation to the Commissioner and Secretary of Meghalaya Legislative Assembly. Speaking to media persons, Saleng Sangma said that he won the election due to the blessing of the people of the state. He also pointed out that he will raise the issues of unemployment, ILP and education sector.
