NEWS IN ORDER:-

POLLS

In Nagaland, an estimated voter turnout of 83.54 percent was recorded in the urban local bodies' elections held in three Municipalities and 21 Town councils yesterday. The election was historic for the State of Nagaland as the polling were conducted after a gap of 20 years, that too, with 33 per cent women reservation. The voting took place in 420 polling stations under 214 wards with 523 candidates in the fray, which included 198 female and 325 male candidates. The State Election Commission said, the polls went off smoothly in all polling stations except one under Dimapur Municipal Council, and a fresh polling was declared at Polling Station No. 4 under Ward 20 of Dimapur Municipal Council to be held tomorrow. Counting of votes will take place on Saturday.

DRUGS

Observing the International Day Against Drug Abuse and Illicit Trafficking and 'Nasha Mukt Bharat Abhiyan,' the Customs Department has conducted a series of awareness and outreach programs as well as destruction of seized drugs to reinforce its commitment to combating drug abuse and trafficking in the North

East. To demonstrate zero-tolerance policy towards drug trafficking, the Customs also conducted a drug destruction campaign in Assam, Manipur, Meghalaya and Mizoram. In the drive, 12.48 kgs Heroin, 45.27 kgs Meth/Yaba Tablets, 5804.78 kgs Ganja and 66,728 bottles of Codeine-based Cough Syrups having a total seizure value of 167.47 crore rupees were destroyed. This was conducted in a secure and environmentally responsible manner, ensuring that these harmful substances are permanently removed from circulation. By conducting these awareness and outreach programmes and destroying seized drugs, the Customs aims to reduce the prevalence of drug abuse and support the global fight against illicit drug trafficking and remains steadfast in its mission to protect the society from the danger of drug abuse and trafficking.

NEIGRIHMS

The demand to grant the status of Institute of National Importance to the North Eastern Indira Gandhi Regional Institute of Health and Medical Sciences 'NEIGRIHMS' in Meghalaya has been pending for years, but renewed efforts are being made to get this for the super specialty hospital in Shillong. NEIGRIHMS Medical Superintendent, Dr C Daniela stated that the institute is continuously striving to obtain the status of Institute of National Importance. Dr Daniela said that the Health Ministry has previously agreed in principle to grant this status to NEIGRIHMS. Once accorded with this status, NEIGRIHMS will be able to independently start postgraduate and super specialty courses with permission from the National Medical Commission. AIR

MANIPUR

The three new criminal laws namely, Bharatiya Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita (BNSS) 2023, Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita (BNS) 2023 and Bharatiya Sakshya Adhiniyam (BSA) 2023 are coming into force in the whole country with effect from 1st July 2024.
