In a social media post yesterday, the Prime Minister said, the 10th International Yoga Day was held at a great scale across the world. He thanked for the collective efforts of individuals, communities and organizations, for practicing Yoga.

YOGA-NE

Meghalaya Governor Phagu Chauhan led the International Yoga Day celebrations held at Raj Bhavan in Shillong. The programme was organised by the NCC Directorate, NER and Group Headquarter, Shillong on the theme "Yoga for Self and Society," which emphasises yoga's impact on personal well-being and community health. The Governor along with the Principal Secretary to the Governor, Harish Chandra Chaudhary, Additional Director, NCC, NE region, Maj Gen. Gagan Deep, 700 cadets of the NCC, officers and staff of Raj Bhavan performed the asanas under the guidance of experienced yoga instructor Bramachari Prem Swaroop from the Art of Living.

Nagaland joined the rest of the world and observed the 10th International Day of Yoga. Various programmes were organised at various locations by the different state departments, NGOs and Assam Rifles.

In Manipur, International Yoga Day was celebrated at Raj Bhavan in Imphal. It was led by Governor Sushri Anusuiya Uikey. She practised yoga asanas with officers, staff and security

In Arunachal Pradesh, various yoga training sessions and awareness programmes were organized on the occasion of Yoga Day. In Itanagar, the State Legislative Assembly also organized a Yoga session. Department of Health and Family Welfare in association with Vihangam Yog organized another yoga awareness session at Hornbill Futsal Ground in Itanagar city.

Sikkim celebrated International Day of Yoga. The state-level event was held at Paljor Stadium of the State capital Gangtok with State Governor Lakshman Prasad Acharya as Chief Guest. Speaking on the occasion, Governor Acharya emphasized the significance of yoga in promoting the stability of both the body and the mind. In Tawang, the International Day of Yoga was observed at Gyalwa Tsangyang Gyatso High altitude stadium in collaboration with the Indian Army. Indian Army also organized yoga sessions for students and the public at the Jung sub-division in the district.
