Prime Minister Narendra Modi was addressing a two day meeting of the BJP Chief Ministers's Councils in New Delhi which concluded on Sunday. The meeting was aimed at reviewing Gorvernance practices and their welfare schemes. PM Modi gave several suggestions on further improving the governance in their respective states, emphasizing on messaging of the welfare schemes for their better delivery. PM Modi emphasized the need to ensure saturation coverage of welfare schemes going on in the BJP-ruled states, saying they should be seen as an example of good governance.

Union Minister of Youth Affairs & Sports and Labour & Employment, Dr. Mansukh Mandaviya in his continuous Endeavour to increase the effectiveness of the MY Bharat Portal chaired an interactive session with the youth engaged in various sectors, including Indian youth delegates who had participated in BRICS Youth Summit in Russia, in New Delhi on Sunday. During the interaction Dr Mandaviya highlighted the importance of aligning the My Bharat platform with activities that resonate with youth and provide them benefits. Along with the rest of the world Global Tiger Day was observed at Pakke Tiger Reserve with a series of events today. The events aimed at collective efforts towards tiger conservation and the recognition of dedicated personnel involved in wildlife protection. Satyaprakash Singh, DFO, Pakke Wildlife Sanctuary & Tiger Reserve informed that the celebration started with a Bike Rally in the morning starting from Seijosa to Delasiri in the fringes of Nameri National Park and Tiger Reserve, Assam. The frontline staffs of the Tiger Reserve were honoured for their exceptional efforts in wildlife protection as part of the celebration. On the occasion, an ex-gratia payment to the tune of 7 Lakhs was also disbursed to more than 134 victims of Human-Wildlife Conflict, recognizing their resilience and support in conservation efforts.

Minister for Sports & Youth Affairs, GoAP, Kento Jini along with Secretary General, Arunachal Olympic Association, Bamang Tago chaired a consultative meeting organized by the East Siang Olympic Association at Siang Guest House on Sunday. Sports Minister said that the State Government has formulated the New Sport Policy with the focus on the tapping the potential of the youth and also we must focus on youth power as the Arunachal Pradesh Govt. has declared 2024-25 as the Year of the Youth keeping immense potential and contribution of the youth in the state's development. Jini urged the Sports body to work for promotion of world-class young sporting talents capable of shining in National and International level in Olympics, to bring laurel to the state and the country.

13th Edition of the State Level Open FIDE Rating Chess Tournament -2024 concluded at Itanagar on Sunday. Dupit Tabu from Upper Subansiri district emerged as the champion. The top four positions were secured by Dupit Tabu, Dupit Tachung, Tamer Nilling and Tapir Mize respectively and will represent the state in the national championship, which will be held in Haryana in August.

On the second day of Paris Olympics, ace Indian Shooter Manu Bhaker opened medals tally for India with a bronze in Women's 10 meter air pistol event on Sunday. With the feat, Manu became the first Indian woman ever to win an Olympic medal in Shooting competition., Meanwhile India's Arjun Babuta finished fourth in Men's 10m Air Rifle event. Arjun is second Indian shooter who missed a medal today, as Ramita Jindal finished seventh in the

women's 10m air rifle final. In Badminton women's singles, India's PV won against Fathimath Nabaaha Abdul Razzaq of Maldives. In women's Boxing 50 kilograms event, Indian boxer Nikhat Zareen defeated Germany's Maxi Carina Kloetzer. In Rowing, India's Balraj Panwar stormed into the men's single sculls quarter-final, competing at the Vaires-sur-Marne Nautical Stadium, the Indian rower finished second in the repechage 2 race behind Monaco's Quentin Antognelli . In Table-Tennis, India's paddler Sreeja Akula qualified for the round of 32 with a commanding 4-0 win over Sweden's Christina Kallberg.
