The government has decided to observe the 25th of June every year as 'Samvidhaan Hatya Diwas'. On this day in 1975, former Prime Minister Indira Gandhi imposed an Emergency in the country. In a social media post, Union Home Minister Amit Shah today said that the decision is intended to honor the spirit of millions who struggled to revive democracy despite facing inexplicable persecution at the hands of an oppressive government.



Member of Parliament Lok Sabha and NPCC President, S Supongmeren Jamir has highlighted the need for restructuring of working system of Congress party in the state. Addressing party workers during a thanksgiving programme held at Congress Bhavan Kohima today, Jamir said there is need for party workers to start mobilising in all 60 Assembly Constituency and work at the

grassroots level in order to prepare themselves for the next general election in 2028. He said, all party workers need to mobilise the party in the state and districts to win over their opponents. To this, Jamir said, the party needs to be screened out and this would be a challenge for 2028, adding that there should be a Congress government in the state. The MP therefore urged all his party workers work hard to meet the expectations of the people. Thanking electorates for giving mandate to congress party in the state, Jamir said, responsibility should be carried forward with utmost humility. Secretary AICC Ranajit Mukerjee, and leaders from frontals, Area Congress Committee and District Congress Committee also spoke during the programme.



Advisor for Animal Husbandry & Veterinary Services, Kazheto Kinimi has said that the PDA Government is committed to bring White Revolution in the state through mass based organization and co-operative societies in line with National Policy on Dairy Development. He was speaking at the inauguration of Mini Dairy Plant cum Dairy Farmers' Training Centre at Marepkong Ward, Mokokchung today. The Unit is set up under National Programme for Dairy Development. The Advisor emphasized on the need to realize Dairy Farming potential in the state while observing that the state is yet to reach self-sufficiency in milk, egg, poultry, livestock and meat production. He encouraged the people, especially younger generation to venture into this sector.



State Mission Director, Samagra Shiksha Nagaland, Temsunaro Ao today emphasized that comprehensive counseling services was crucial today given the challenges of modern living, academic pressures and impacts of technology on youth. She was addressing Graduation Day of Diploma Holders in School Counseling, SCERT, Nagaland in Kohima. She encouraged teachers to keep learning and staying updated with latest research and techniques. Highlighting that National Education Policy 2020 underscores importance of holistic

development of students, the director said students require not only academic support but also socio-emotional support to thrive in their educational journey. SCERT Director Kevirale-ü Kerhuo informed that in 2018, SCERT Nagaland pioneered the diploma course with the vision to provide hands-on, practical training in school counseling. They have completed the fourth batch of the course and trained 128 teachers. The fifth batch of the course is currently ongoing. Professor and Head of the Guidance and Counseling Cell at SCERT, Dr. Zavise Rume pointed out the need for the state government to formulate a strong policy for recruitment and establish a regulatory body to enforce counseling ethics. 32 teacher graduates from 2019 batch and 21 from 2022 batch were awarded certificates.



Advisor, Urban Development & Municipal Affairs, Zhaleo Rio inaugurated Bamboo Rural Haat at Piphema under Medziphema sub-division in Chumukedima district today. The Advisor called the villagers of Piphema to maintain cleanliness and take care of infrastructure noting that National Highway-29 passes through the village and is an attraction for tourists visiting Nagaland. The Advisor also inaugurated farmers marketing shed at Tsiepama Village in Chumoukedima district today. He said that the market shed have lot of potential as travellers and tourists visiting Nagaland passes through it while providing platform for villagers to sell their local and organic products.



Advisor for Agriculture Mhathung Yanthan inaugurated new common facility cum collection centre at Okotso village in Wokha district today. He highlighted the region's vast potential for cultivating fresh organic vegetables and fruits. The Advisor noted that a lack of storage facilities had been a major hindrance and therefore the new centre was a crucial development for the region. Yanthan urged villagers to maximize production, and said that the new centre will enable them to store their produce and facilitate distribution to other districts and markets. District Agriculture Officer Wokha, Sunep Longchar

encouraged farmers to keep facility stock with fresh produce. The Advisor also visited Government Higher Secondary School in Sungro Village. He said he is in constant contact with Samagra Shiksha Abhiyan to address concerns of the school and informed that the department will take up infrastructure needs by August this year. The Advisor also donated solar inverter among others to facilitate electricity issues faced by the school.



State Institute of Rural Development organized valedictory programme for 6th batch on Rural Development Foundation Course 2024 yesterday. Department of Rural Development Commissioner & Secretary Kevis Kense congratulated officials who undertook the training and urged them to be sincere towards their duties for upliftment of rural populace. He assured all possible support to conduct more up skilling programme for department officials and up gradation of infrastructural development. Course Director & Principal, ETC Phek, Dr Kedise Pucho reviewed details of foundation course that 29 selected Block Officials underwent. He said it encompasses related subjects in all allied departments including legal matters.



Director of Minority Affairs, Shashank Pratap Singh has said that minority affairs department has been created in the state to address political and administrative issues of the minority community. Speaking at an awareness programme in Chumoukedima, Singh said schemes like Pradhan Mantri Jan Vikas Karyakram identifies minority percentage blocks where minority population of more than 25 percent can take a project to fill gaps in various socio economic indicators and added that all blocks in Nagaland are eligible to take up projects under PMJVK. The director added that PM VIKAS scheme promotes handicrafts, artisan and infrastructure development for the minority.



Executive Engineer, Electrical Division Mon, K Tingtenmoie Konyak has informed that 33 kV transmission line from 33/11kV Substation, Aboi upto 33/11kV Substation, Mopong will be test charged at the rated voltage on 16th July at 9:00 AM and will remain charged thereafter. The transmission line passes through Aboi, Mopong, Angjangyang Town and villages of Ngangching, Mohung, Longching, Changlang, Jakphang, Ukha Lampong and Ukha Village. In this regard, the department have asked public not to touch or go near the said line to avoid any risk.
