Prime Minister Narendra Modi today asserted that his government has been solely guided by the motto of India first and its policy of zero tolerance against corruption has received people's support in the recent Lok Sabha polls. He said his government has followed the policy of justice for all and appeasement to none. Modi stated this while replying in the Lok Sabha on the Motion of Thanks to the President Droupadi Murmu's address to the joint sitting of both the Houses. He praised the people of the country for showing maturity and wisdom in the General Election. Modi added that people have trusted the policies, intent and dedication of his Government, and as a reason, voted the NDA back to power for a third consecutive term. The Prime Minister said his government has been working with a mantra of Sabka Saath Sabka Vikas.



Prime Minister Narendra Modi today urged NDA Members of Parliament to adhere to the rules of Parliament, uphold the principles of Parliamentary Democracy, and exhibit good conduct, which he said is essential for being a good MP. Modi stated this while addressing the NDA Parliamentary Party meeting in New Delhi this morning. This was the first meeting of NDA since the formation of the new government. Minister, Kiran Rijiju informed that the Prime Minister guided all NDA MPs on proper conduct. He conveyed that the Prime Minister also emphasized that every MP has been elected to serve the country and regardless of the party they belong to, service to the nation is their foremost responsibility. Justice Chandrachud said the Courts are designed to give people a sense of governance by laws, not by arbitrary decisions.



Wokha Police organized an awareness seminar on the three New Criminal Laws for the Police jawans at Bhandari Police Station yesterday. Addressing the seminar, Sub-divisional Police Officer of Bhandari, Vekato Chishi said the three New Criminal Laws, Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita 2023 (BNS), Bharatiya Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita 2023 (BNSS) and Bharatiya Sakshya Adhiniyan 2023 (BSA) will reshaped the legal landscape in India by replacing the Old British- Era Criminal Laws, namely the Indian Penal Code (IPC), Code of Criminal Procedure Code (CRPC) and The Indian Evidence Act. The Police Officers emphasized that understanding the new laws properly will help the Jawans for preparedness and implementation of the laws effectively and to handle any cases or situation accordingly.

Incessant rain in Nagaland is causing havoc in various districts across the state. In Chessore area under Shamator district, landslides and floods continue to occur, affecting normal life. The Chessore- Huker- Y. Anner valley, which is known as the Rice Bowl for Yimkhiungrüs was hit worst with almost 60 percent of paddy

fields sweep away as reported by the village council. In Tuensang district, the National Highway-202 between N Yangli and Mangangkhi villages has been fully cut off. The PWD (Highways) has deployed two excavators to clear off the debris since this morning. The District Disaster Management Authority is assessing the extent of damage. In Kiphire district, incessant rains has caused soil erosion, damaging paddy fields along the banks of Thusangki river. Meanwhile, the India Meteorological Department (IMD) announced today that the southwest monsoon has now covered the entire country, six days ahead of the normal date. The weather office had forecast that the country is likely to get above-average rainfall in July as the monsoon has picked up momentum. It has further forecast widespread light to moderate rainfall accompanied by thunderstorms, and lightning with heavy to very heavy rainfall over Northeast India, Sub-Himalayan West Bengal, and Sikkim during the next five days.



Union Minister of Mines, G. Kishan Reddy along with Minister of State, Satish Chandra Dubey today inaugurated District Mineral Foundation (DMF) Gallery at Shastri Bhawan in New Delhi.
