MAAN KI BAAT

Prime Minister Narendra Modi expressed pride that Charaideo Maidam of Assam is being included in the UNESCO World Heritage Sites. Addressing the nation in his Mann Ki Baat programme on Akashvani yesterday, the Prime Minister highlighted that it will be the 43rd site of India in the list, and the first Cultural World Heritage site from the Northeast. Elaborating on why it is such an important place, Mr Modi said Charaideo was the first capital of the Ahom dynasty. The people of the Ahom dynasty traditionally kept the mortal remains of their ancestors and their valuables in the Maidam. Prime Minister added that the Maidam is a symbol of reverence for the departed kings and dignitaries of the Ahom Empire. Prime Minister termed it as a great feat for the Ahom Empire to sustain from the 13th century till the beginning of the 19th century. He stated that the principles and beliefs of the Ahom Empire were so strong that they kept this dynasty alive for a long time. Mr Modi also recalled unveiling the tallest statue of the great Ahom warrior Lachit Borphukan on 9th March this year.

SCHEMES

Union Minister of Tribal Affairs, Jual Oram said that there has been a growth of 73 per cent in the allocated fund to implement schemes linked to the welfare of tribal

community in the country. Addressing a press conference in Agartala yesterday to highlight the important aspects of the Union Budget-2024-25, Mr. Oram said, whooping Rs 13,000 crore will be spent on the schemes meant for tribal community in the country. He said that Budget 2024 categorically laid emphasis on the welfare of poor, empowering women, employment for the youth by enabling them to become skilled and subsequently entrepreneurs and to ensure that the farmers prosper by selling their produce at a standard rate. He said, 14 projects under Northeast Special Infrastructure Development Scheme have been approved for Tripura with a cost of 458 crore rupees. The Minister said the Pradhan Mantri Janjati Unnat Gram Abhiyan Scheme will cover 63,000 villages in the country and it will lay thrust on augmenting the infrastructure such as road connectivity, power supply, and medical facility among others.

Union Minister of State for Minority Affairs, George Kurian has said that the government is working for the inclusive development of the minorities and it is moving forward with the Prime Minister's vision of Sabka Saath, Sabka Vikas, Sabka Vishwas and Sabka Prayaas.
