Both Houses Of Parliament took Up Discussion On Union Budget 2024-2025 yesterday. In Lok Sabha Initiating the discussion, Kumari Selja of Congress raised the issue of unemployment saying it is increasing day by day in the country. She questioned why the Government is not taking steps to fill up vacancies in Central Government Departments. Biplab Kumar Deb of BJP said, that when the BJP Government came to power in 2014, India was in fragile five. He said, the Government has made the economic system transparent. Deb said the Economic Survey has estimated a real GDP growth of 6.5 per cent to 7 per cent in 2024-25. In Rajya Sabha, Congress MP P Chidambaram raised the issues of unemployment and inflation. He said unemployment is the biggest problem saying that the Production Linked Incentive scheme has not generated enough jobs in the country.
