Chief Justice of India, DY Chandrachud said that if the principles of law cannot be explained to the general public in simple terms, then there is a flaw in the legal profession and legal education. During his address at the convocation of Dr. Ram Manohar Lohia National Law University in Lucknow, the CJI emphasized the need to teach law in regional languages. CJI Chandrachud and Chief Minister of Uttar Pradesh Yogi Adityanath distributed degrees to the students. Speaking on the occasion, CJI said laws related to regional issues should also be taught in our universities. He said that as CJI, he has issued many instructions to make the justice process more accessible for the common people. For example, the Supreme Court decisions provided in English are being translated into various languages recognised

in the Constitution of India, allowing the public to understand the content of these decisions. During his address, CM Yogi Adityanath said that the rule of law is the precondition for good governance. He added that India is now recognised for its rule of law. It plays a crucial role in changing perceptions of the country.



Power Department Nagaland has cautioned consumers against new scam involving fraudulent messages. The department said scammers posing as Power Department are sending fake SMS, WhatsApp, and email messages, claiming that consumers electricity will be disconnected due to non-payment. The Department said these messages are not genuine because of lack essential details such as Consumer ID, name, and billed amount. It said such messages without Consumer ID, Name and Billed amount do not originate from the Department. In this regard, consumers have been advised to be vigilant and not to respond to these messages, click on any links or attachments, or call any numbers mentioned.



Union Home Minister Amit Shah reviewed the implementation of Vibrant Villages Programme at a high-level meeting in New Delhi today. During the meeting, Shah said, under the leadership of Prime Minister Narendra Modi, government is committed to the all-round development of the border villages. The Minister said that Central Armed Police Forces and Army deployed around the border villages should encourage purchase of local agricultural and handicraft products through cooperatives. He said that the healthcare facilities of the Army and CAPFs should be regularly made available to benefit the residents of nearby villages. He said, more than six hundred projects have been sanctioned by the Central government for employment generation in these villages. Under the Vibrant Villages Programme scheme, 136 border villages are being provided connectivity through 113 all-

weather road projects at a cost of two thousand 420 crore rupees. Appropriate steps are also being taken to ensure financial inclusion in all these villages and India Post-Payment Banks are also being facilitated there.



The first college in Niuland, Platinum College initiated by Western Sümi Baptist Akukuhou Küqhakulu, WSBK in commemoration of its Platinum Jubilee was inaugurated by Minister for Public Health Engineering Department Jacob Zhimomi at Nihokhu village, Niuland today. He opined that vocational skills and technical education are important for unemployed youths to become self-reliant. The Minister expressed concern over high rate of unemployment in the state and remarked that unemployed youths are dependent on their parents. On subject matter, he emphasized on the need to take up technical subjects, particularly science and mathematics, which are in high demand. WSBK Secretary, Hetovi Ayemi said the college is situated on a 67-acre campus and offers undergraduate courses in Arts and Music. Ayemi said future expansions include multidisciplinary courses and additional facilities. The college's academic session commenced this year for graduate courses with 104 students and Bachelor of Music with 12 students.



Nagaland is likely to receive heavy to very heavy rainfall tomorrow. Indian Meterological Department has issued an orange alert for Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram and Tripura indicating heavy to very heavy rainfall tomorrow. IMD said that the probability is very likely and rainfall severity has been predicted at 115.6 to 204.4 millimeters in these states.

Don Bosco Higher Secondary School, Wokha held a cultural activity under the theme Sustaining Traditions- Cultural Preservation at its school premise today. Principal Rev Fr TC Joseph urged students to learn and delve into knowing one's

culture and heritage. Fr. Joseph also said that the school is integrating cultural aspects into its educational system by introducing skill programme through Arts & Crafts. Activities like traditional shawl weaving, earring designing, bamboo plate making, and basket weaving were held.



Minister for Women Resource Development and Horticulture Salhoutuonuo Kruse has urged Gorkha Community to preserve and promote their tradition. She was addressing the District Level Celebration of 210th Bhanu Jayanti at Chümoukedima District today.

She acknowledged the Gorkha community in Nagaland and thanked them for the privileged to be present at the celebration. Chakhroma Youth Organisation President Seyieneilhou Keyho asked the Gorkha Community in Chümoukedima to be united and build good relationships with other communities. Bhanu Jayanti is observed annually to commemorate Nepali literature luminary Bhanubhakta Acharya.



Assam Rifles has apprehended 3 persons for possession of contraband in Dimapur on 10th July. It said Assam Rifles established Mobile Vehicle Check Post and after intercepting a vehicle. On carrying out thorough search, the team recovered 1,134 grams of suspected Heroin in 81 plastic soap cases which is estimated to be worth over 7 crore rupees. The Assam rifles said recovered arms, ammunition, magazines and stores have been handed over to Nagaland Police.



Assam Rifles has emerged champion of the 2nd Assam Rifles Sentinels Cup after defeating 165 TA team at Laitkor Garrison in Shillong. Earlier, seven teams from participated in the tournament. Assam Rifles said through the tournament it is
