Prime Minister Narendra Modi has said that the country's GDP is growing at eight per cent and the day is not far when it will become third largest economy globally. Addressing the inaugural session of Journey Towards Viksit Bharat: A Post Union Budget 2024-25 Conference in New Delhi today, Modi said, India has reached new highs even after battling pandemic. He said, Government is focusing on all sectors. Modi said, the speed and scale at which the government is building infrastructure is unprecedented. He said, in 2004, in the first budget of the UPA government, Capital expenditure was around 90 thousand crore rupees and it increased to two lakh crore rupees in 2014. The Prime Minister said the budget size has now increased three times to 48 lakh crore rupees. He said the government has made a record increase in allocation of Ministries. Modi said, India is the only country with high growth and low inflation. The day-long Conference is being organised by the Confederation of Indian Industry.



Central Government is promoting organic farming using organic manure through the schemes of Paramparagat Krishi Vikas Yojana, PKVY in all the states other than the North Eastern States. The government is promoting Mission Organic Value Chain Development for North Eastern Region, MOVCDNER exclusively in the northeast states. Informing the Lok Sabha through a written reply today, Minister of State for Agriculture and Farmers Welfare Ramnath Thakur said that under the MOVCDNER scheme, farmers are directly provided financial assistance of 32 thousand 500 rupees per hectare for three years for off-farm and on-farm organic inputs.



In Kerala, at least 84 people have been killed in a major landslide in the hilly Wayanad district this morning following heavy rains at Mundakkai, Attamala and Chooramala regions. The death toll is likely to go up. More than 120 injured persons have been admitted to various hospitals. Official sources said, over 100 persons are

reportedly missing. President Droupadi Murmu and Vice President Jagdeep Dhankhar and Prime Minister Narendra Modi have expressed condolences over the loss of lives in the landslides in Wayanad. Prime Minister Narendra Modi has announced an ex-gratia of two lakh rupees from the Prime Minister's National Relief Fund for the next of kin of each deceased in the landslides. The injured will be given 50 thousand rupees. the Prime Minister said that rescue operations are currently underway to assist all those affected. NDRF, Indian Army Units have been pressed into recue and relief operations.



Nagaland Governor La Ganesan and Chief Minister Neiphiu Rio have extended warm Naknyulüm greetings to Chang brothers and sisters. The Governor in his greeting message said that Naknyulüm festival marks our deliverance from darkness and coincides with the first harvest of the year. He said it is also a time for strengthening bonds through the exchange of gifts and delicacies among friends and relatives. The Governor expressed hope that Naknyulüm festival brings peace and unity among the community. Chief Minister Neiphiu Rio in his greeting message said that Naknyulüm festival celebrates the triumph of good over evel.
