Union Cooperation Minister Amit Shah has said that the government will set up multi-purpose Primary Agricultural Credit Society (PACS) in around two lakh gram panchayats within the next five years. Shah announced this while addressing the Sahakar se Samriddhi program held at Mahatma Mandir in Gandhinagar on the occasion of 102nd International Day of Cooperation. Emphasizing on economic cooperation among cooperatives, Shah urged all the district and state cooperatives of the country to conduct their financial transactions only in cooperative banks in order to strengthen the cooperative bank network. Talking about the several initiatives taken by the Central Government for the empowerment of the cooperative sector in the country, Shah stressed on expanding the cooperative network to make cooperatives viable. On the occasion, the Minister launched the Gujarat Government's Special Assistance Scheme for farmers on the Purchase of Nano Urea. Shah also virtually inaugurated Amul's first organic store in Delhi and also launched Bharat organic Atta produced by the National Cooperative Organics Limited. He appealed to the people to buy products from the two brands.

The Budget Session of Parliament will begin from 22nd of this month. Parliamentary Affairs Minister, Kiren Rijiju in social media post informed that the session will continue till 12th August. He

said, the Union Budget 2024-25 will be presented in the Lok Sabha on 23rd July. Rijiju said, President Droupadi Murmu on the recommendation of Government of India has approved the proposal for summoning of both the Houses of Parliament for the Budget Session.

University today declared the under-graduate Nagaland provisional results of Bachelor of Arts, Commerce, Science, Computer Application and Business Administration, which was conducted in May. A total of 8,435 appeared, out of which 6,197 passed the exam with a percentage of 73.47. The University has informed that college principals or authorized personnel can collect the marksheets during office hours from July 11. The controller of examination stated that application for correction in the marksheets, if any should be submitted to the university within one month from the date of declaration of result along with justification and accompanied by original marksheets. Further it informed that re-evaluation should come through the college principals to be submitted to Lumami office hours on or before July 24.
