Union Minister of Ports, Shipping & Waterways, Sarbananda Sonowal has announced major initiatives aimed at enabling the waterways potential of Nagaland. The Supreme Court yesterday issued notice on a fresh batch of petitions filed by the National Testing Agency (NTA), seeking the transfer of pleas pending before the Rajasthan High Court related to the alleged NEET-UG paper leak, to the apex court. A bench comprising Chief Justice D Y Chandrachud, Justice J B Pardiwala, and Justice Manoj Misra issued the notice to the petitioners before the Rajasthan High Court and tagged the transfer petitions with the already pending matters in the issue. However, the Bench refused to pass a formal order staying the proceedings pending before the Rajasthan High Court.

Union Home Minister and Minister of Cooperation Amit Shah will chair the 7th apexlevel meeting of the Narco-Coordination Center (NCORD) in New Delhi tomorrow.
