The government said that the UNICEF report which highlights that India has a high number of zero-dose children depicts an incomplete picture of the country's immunization data. In a statement, the Union Health Ministry yesterday said the media reports claiming India has a high number of 'zero-dose children'-children who did not receive any vaccine. do not factor in the population base and immunization coverage of the countries compared. The Ministry added that the reports present a flawed comparison with countries without considering India's population and high vaccination coverage. It emphasized that the accurate and complete narrative of the immunization efforts of the government can be gauged through a comprehensive understanding of the relative data and programmatic interventions. The Ministry highlighted that, percentage of the total population, zero-dose children account for 0.11 percent of the country's total population. It observed that due to India's large population size, it has the highest number of vaccinated children across countries.

National Highways Authority of India, NHAI will charge double toll from vehicles with Non-affixed FASTag on front windshield. The authority said that deliberate non-affixation of FASTag on the windscreen leads to unnecessary delays at the toll plazas causing inconvenience to the National Highway users. It said, detailed Standard Operating Procedures have been issued to all User Fee Collection Agencies and Concessionaires to charge double user fees in case of non-affixation of FASTag on the front windshield. At present, the user fee is collected for approximately 45 thousand kilometres of National Highways and

Expressways at around one thousand Toll Plazas across the country. With a penetration rate of around 98 percent and over eight crore users, FASTag has revolutionized the Electronic Toll Collection system in the country.

Micro, Small and Medium Enterprises Minister Jitan Ram Manjhi has said that the empowerment of rural entrepreneurs is the key to ensuring holistic growth of the MSME Sector. Manjhi said this while inaugurating the New Skill Development Training Programme in New Delhi.
