Kiphire Town Chamber of Commerce and Industry (KTCCI) has installed 36 CCTV cameras across various strategic locations in the town. A press release from the KTCCI stated that installation of the CCTV, which was completed yesterday is an initiative to enhance security and surveillance in Kiphire. Agriculture Minister Shivraj Singh Chouhan has said that around eight thousand eight hundred Farmers' Producer Organizations (FPOs) have been set up across the country as against the target of ten thousand FPOs. Farmers' Producer Organizations facilitate farmers with access to improved technology, credit, better input and more markets to incentivise them to produce better quality commodities. Talking to reporters after visiting FPO Mela at Delhi Haat yesterday, Chouhan said, it is Prime Minister Narendra Modi's initiative for customers to get products at cheaper price and farmers to produce, process and get good prices.

Telecom Regulatory Authority of India, TRAI has notified amendments to the regulatory framework for broadcasting and cable services and releases. TRAI has removed the ceiling on network capacity fee, NCF of 130 rupees for 200 channels and 160 rupees for more than 200 channels. The fee will now be driven by market forces. In order to ensure transparency, the regulator said that all charges have to be mandatorily published by service providers and communicated to consumers, besides reporting to it. The primary objective of these amendments includes facilitating the growth of the broadcasting sector and promoting ease of doing business by simplifying the regulatory provisions.

Congress Leader Rahul Gandhi appealed people of Manipur to stop violence and come out for peace and unity. Gandhi reached Manipur yesterday on a one-day state visit. He met violence affected families

taking shelter in different relief camps in the State. Talking to media persons, Gandhi said that his visit to Manipur is not politically motivated, but to share the grief and pain of the affected families. He also assured that he will try hard to bring an amicable solution to the violence in the State. Gandhi later called on Governor of Manipur Sushri Anusuiya Uikey and discussed the situation in Manipur.

In the Sentinels Cup North-East Women Championship, Naga Damsels Club, representing Nagaland has bowed out of the tournament, conceding 4 goals to nil against the championship favorites, the Director General Assam Rifles (DGAR) team yesterday at Sonitpur in Assam.
