**PM:**

**Prime Minister Narendra Modi yesterday expressed gratitude to the people for reiterating their faith in the constitution and the democratic systems of the country. Addressing the nation in his first Mann ki Baat programme after the General elections on Akashvani, the Prime Minister highlighted that the 2024 Lok Sabha Elections were the biggest in the world in which 65 crore people cast their votes. Mr. Modi spoke about the special campaign launched on World Environment Day this year, 'Ek Ped Maa Ke Naam'. He appealed to people to plant a tree along with their mothers, or in their mothers' name. Touching upon the subject of Yoga, the Prime Minister said that the whole world celebrated the 10th International Day of Yoga with enthusiasm.**

**LAWS:**

**The three New Criminal Laws- Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita, 2023, Bharatiya Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita, 2023 and Bharatiya Sakshya Adhinyam, 2023, come into force today. The government of India has held regular meetings with States and Union Territories and they are fully geared up in terms of technology, capacity building and awareness generation to implement the new Criminal Laws. A report says that these Bills were passed by the Parliament during the winter session last year. The new criminal laws mark a significant step towards empowering Indian citizens.**

### **APPEAL:**

Manipur Governor Sushri Anusuiya Uikey yesterday appealed to all stakeholders to co-operate with each other to resolve the ongoing crisis in the State and restore peace and tranquillity in the best interest of the people of Manipur. Speaking at a ceremony held in connection to the Children Theatre Workshop in Imphal, the Governor said that every section of society, most importantly women and children has been affected by the present situation in Manipur. She expressed her serious concern over the situation in the State and said that as a guardian of the State, steps to resolve the crisis have been taken up by insisting the central leaders from time to time and some tangible result will be seen in the near future. During the ceremony, the Governor of Manipur also interacted with one hundred twenty displaced children along with their guardians and distributed certificates for their participation in various events during the workshop.

### **NEET:**

Deputy Chief Minister of Maharashtra Ajit Pawar said Central and state governments have taken serious note of the malpractices in the 'NEET' examination for admission to medical courses and action has been initiated by various agencies. While replying to the Leader of Opposition Vijay Wadettivar and State Congress President Nana Patole who have raised the issue of malpractices in the 'NEET' examination in the Legislative Assembly through an adjournment motion, Mr Pawar said there have been incidents of paper leaking in the 'NEET' examination all over the country following which the culprits have been arrested. Deputy Chief Minister Ajit Pawar said the state government is committed to ensure that the students who study day and night and give their exams honestly do not suffer due to such malpractices.

### **MILK:**

'Gwala Diwas' honoring the state's milk producers is being celebrated in Sikkim today. Governor Acharya praised the initiative for empowering milk producers and boosting the rural economy. ### **WEATHER:**

The Indian Meteorological Department has issued orange and red alerts over Northeast India during the next 4 to 5 days due to heavy to very heavy rainfall. The IMD said that heavy rainfall will prevail over parts Northeast in the next 3 to 4 days. Non-stop heavy rainfall continues in various parts of Arunachal Pradesh. Road communication to many interior places have been cut-off due to landslides triggered by heavy rain. Due to incessant rainfall in the upstream areas of Arunachal Pradesh, the Brahmaputra River has experienced a rapid rise in its water levels, leading to an alarming situation.
