LAWS:

Union Home Minister Amit Shah has said that the three criminal laws, which came into effect from Monday, will lead to the most modern criminal justice system in the country. He said the criminal justice system is now completely 'Swadeshi' and embedded in Indian ethos after independence. Briefing media in New Delhi about the three criminal laws, Mr. Shah said the new laws will ensure speedy justice, and victim's rights. He added that earlier, only the rights of the Police were protected but now, victims' and complainants' rights will also be protected. The Home Minister said the priority in new laws has been given to crimes against women and children. He said, new laws will also have the provisions against mob lynching.

ENACTMENT:

Manipur Chief Minister Mr. N. Biren Singh said that the three criminal laws implemented across the country from yesterday will be of great help to the people, as there are provisions for maximum of two adjournments in court cases and filling zero FIR at any police station. Addressing a function held at Imphal in connection to the enactment of three new criminal laws, Mr. Biren Singh said that three laws, Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita, Bharatiya Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita and Bharatiya Sakshya Adhiniyam have provisions to file FIRs in one's own dialect. He said that these laws will be very effective; however, at the same time the implementation part is also very crucial. He said that the implementing agencies including security officers, lawyers have to perform their duty sincerely to serve the purposes of new criminal laws. The Central Government introduced these laws as the existing laws were inadequate to address the technological advancements and societal shifts that have over the past few decades.

SUGGESTIONS:

The Government has sought suggestions and responses from students and parents to develop robust mechanisms in the National Testing Agency. In a social media post, Information and Broadcasting Ministry said that high-level committee constituted under the chairmanship of Dr. K. Radhakrishnan has sought suggestions, views, and ideas from students and parents.

RAIN:

In Arunachal Pradesh, incessant heavy rainfall continues to wreak havoc across the state. India Meteorological Department has issued red alert for 9 districts in Arunachal Pradesh. Rests of the districts are either in orange or yellow zone. In Papum Pare District, all the water bodies and the Pare River are flowing above the danger level after a cloud burst occurred yesterday inundating many low laying areas with flood water. As a result of it, the Pare Hydro project near Sagalee on the Pare River has also started releasing water from the dam. In the Capital City Itanagar, district administration has directed to close all the schools for the next five days due to non-stop heavy rain. Road blockades due to landslides triggered by heavy rain have been reported from multiple locations along the Pasighat-Pagin-Aalo road (NH13). Siang District administration in a public advisory has appealed not to avoid the route during heavy rain and night hours. Restoration works are underway for clearing the blocked roads.

DIVAS:

Sikkim yesterday observed the 'Gwala Diwas' honouring the state's milk producers. Governor Lakshman Prasad Acharya and Chief Minister Prem Singh Tamang extended congratulations and best wishes to the people, particularly dairy farmers.
