DISCUSSION

Mizoram Chief Minister Lalduhoma yesterday called on Prime Minister Narendra Modi at the latter's residence in New Delhi. The duo discussed shifting of Assam Rifles from the heart of Aizawl city to the new allocated camp at "Zokhawthar", which is about 10 kms from Aizawl. They have also discussed the state Government's flagship program "Bana Kaih", which is a "Handholding Policy" aimed at giving financial support and promotion of entrepreneurs of the state. The Chief Minister also briefed the Prime Minister on the Zo ethnic "Bawm" refugees from Bangladesh. Lalduhoma also presented some of the organic produce of Mizoram such as Passion Fruit, Dragon Fruit, Banana and Bamboo shoot to the Prime Minister. The Chief Minister informed that the state Government is giving top priority on Agriculture and Horticulture sectors for the economic development of the State.

JUBILEE

In Mizoram, the Golden Jubilee celebration of the Mizo Hmeichhe Insuihkhawm Pawl, which is the state's largest women's organization was held across the state yesterday. The state-level celebration was held at Assam Rifle's 'Lammual' in the heart of Aizawl city. Speaking on the historic occasion, Home Minister K Sapdanga lauded the women's community of Mizoram for their active participation in the overall development of the state. The Home Minister said that MHIP has

contributed a yeoman's service for the State and appreciated its activities for the last 50 years. Sapdanga said that women are the torch bearer of society and family. He said that their dedication to the society is much appreciable. The lone women's Cabinet Minister Lalrinpuii, who also attended the celebration, said that the Mizo women have made great strived progress in all walks of life in recent times.

FLOOD

In flood-hit Assam, there is no respite from incessant rains across the state. Nearly 24 lakh people are affected in the second wave of floods. Six persons lost their lives in the last 24 hours. Rescue and relief measures are being carried out by the administration. Several ministers of the state visited flood-hit areas. Some parts of Guwahati also witnessed waterlogging. Flood water also damaged infrastructure, cropland and animals.

ABHIYAN

In Assam, the Sampoornata Abhiyan is being implemented at different Aspirational Districts in the state. As part of the event, various events have been organised today at Baksa district. An awareness rally was held this morning by the Speaker of the Bodoland Territorial Council Katiram Bodo and District Commissioner Krishna Baruah. The district administration has also organised an art competition among school students today.

CELEBRATION

In Manipur, the 75th State Level Van Mahotsav was celebrated yesterday at Lamdeng Makha Leikai under Imphal West district. As part of the celebration, the State Forest and Environment Th. Biswajit led others in a tree plantation drive in which around two thousand seeding were planted to make a greener future. The celebration was held under the theme 'Ek Ped- Maa ki naam pe' and the participants including many students along with their mother took pledge under Lifestyle for Environment. An awareness campaign called 'Know your Tree' was also launched by the State Forest Department during the celebration in order to provide information of important trees across the Imphal City with creative signages on the trees. CRPF, representatives from Civil Society Organisation and local elected members.

ILP

In Meghalaya, the Khasi Student's Union Central body led by its president Lambokstar Marngar and general Secretary Donald Thabah along with the members yesterday erected the Inner Line Permit check gate at Pahammawlein village under the National Highway-6 in Ri Bhoi, as to protest over the adamant attitude of the state government to combat illegal influx into the state. Beside the erection of check gate, the KSU leaders and members also conducted checking of public vehicles saying that outsiders would not be allowed to enter the state without valid documents. The Magistrate and Ri Bhoi Police rushed to the spot and intervened the matter and urging the KSU to stop erecting of ILP check gate and also urged for talk.
