Prime Minister Narendra Modi is on a three day visit to Poland and Ukraine. Modi will hold talks with his Polish counterpart Donald Tusk and will call on President Andrzej Duda. Modi will also interact with the Indian community, business leaders and prominent Ideologists. The Prime Minister said that Poland is a key economic partner in Central Europe. Modi said, he will be visiting Ukraine on Friday at the invitation of President Volodymyr Zelenskyy and this is the first-ever visit by an Indian Prime Minister to Ukraine since bilateral relations began in 1992. He said, he looks forward to the opportunity to build upon earlier conversations President Zelenskyy on strengthening bilateral cooperation and share perspectives on peaceful resolution of the ongoing Ukraine conflict.



Nagaland Medical Students Association, NMSA has strongly opposed the Health and Family Welfare Department's notification to conduct departmental examination for regularization of doctors appointed on contractual basis during the COVID-19 pandemic. NMSA demanded that all sanctioned Medical Officer posts currently occupied by

COVID-19 contractual doctors, should be advertised and NPSC Combined Technical through filled Examination. NMSA in a press release today said that state government's decision to conduct departmental examination for regularization of doctors appointed on contractual basis effectively restricts examination opportunities to only the 98 contractual doctors appointed during the pandemic. It said that the government notification is against established norms and poses a significant threat to the careers of countless deserving medical professionals. The NMSA strongly urged the government to reconsider its decision and uphold the principles of fairness and meritocracy. NMSA also forwarded a representation to all the appropriate authorities for their consideration.

Naga Students' Federation, NSF has said that it will conduct physical verification of documents of all candidates selected through NEET for various courses, at the NSF office in Kohima on August 22 and 23. NSF asserted that only candidates who are Nagas by blood from Nagaland state are eligible for seats allotted under the Nagaland state quota. The

students' body said that it will not tolerate non-indigenous candidates applying under the state quota. It said verification process requires candidates to appear in person, accompanied by their parents or guardians. NSF has asked the Candidates to come along with their original documents, including a recent passport-sized photograph, NEET documents, HSLC and HSSLC Admit Cards, Scheduled Tribe certificate, and Indigenous Certificate. Further, NSF said that candidates who fail to complete the verification process within the specified dates will be deemed ineligible, and appropriate actions taken against defaulters.

Nagaland Governor has declare the 24th of August 2024, 4th Saturday, as a working day for all State Government offices located in Kohima in view of the forthcoming 5th Session of the 14th Nagaland Legislative Assembly commencing from 27th August 2024. All Administrative Heads and Heads of Departments have been asked to ensure attendance of the officers and staff of their respective departments on the aforementioned date.

The Bharatiya Janata Party, BJP today conducted a workshop on Sadasyata Abhiyan membership drive aimed at expanding party membership and strengthening grassroots engagement, at Lions Club, Dimapur. Speaking at the programme, Nagaland Deputy Chief Minister Y Pattton urged party members to keep in mind the unique challenges and opportunities faced in Nagaland and tailor their approach to resonate with the aspirations of the young and dynamic population. Member of Parliament and BJP National Secretary, Kamakhya Prasad Tasa, in his keynote address highlighted the significance of civic engagement and the role parties in political driving of national progress.

National People's Party, NPP 17th Chizami Assembly Constituency, has urged Nagaland government to urgently address the deteriorating condition of Pfutsero-Zhavame road. It stressed that the road is a critical inter-state route connecting Nagaland with Manipur and is the main artery for the villages of Tsüpfüme, Razeba, Zelome, and Zhavame. The party criticized the government for years of neglecting the

important road. It said that the Pfutsero-Chillo road, despite its vital role, has seen little to no maintenance for years, leaving it in a pathetic and awful state. It said that The Razeba area, recognized for its agricultural potential, has suffered significant setbacks as farmers struggle to transport their produce to markets. Further, Zhavame and Tsüpfüme villages, known as a 'Vegetable Village' and 'Ground Apple Village,' respectively have faced considerable losses due to poor road conditions. In this regard, the NPP demanded the government to construct safe all-weather road to ensure the well-being and economic stability of the Razeba area.
