During the last leg of her three nation tour, President visited Droupadi Murmu Timor Leste, where she was conferred the country's highest civilian award - the Grand Collar of the Order of Timor-Leste. She held bilateral discussions with the President and Prime Minister of the island country in Dili yesterday. Prime Minister Narendra Modi has expressed immense pride over President Droupadi Murmu's recognition. In a social media post, Modi said that it is a proud moment for country to see the Indian President being honoured with highest civilian award of Timor-Leste. He said this prestigious honor reflects strong ties and mutual respect between India and Timor-Leste. Modi said that it is also a recognition of her monumental contribution to public life for several years.



Prime Minister Narendra Modi today released 109 high-yielding, climate-resilient, and biofortified crop varieties at the India Agricultural Research Institute in New Delhi. The 109 varieties of 61

crops include 34 field crops and 27 horticultural crops. Among the field crops, seeds of various kinds of cereal including millets, forage crops, oilseeds, pulses, sugarcane, cotton, fiber, and other potential crops were released. The horticultural crops will cover different varieties of fruits, vegetables, plantation crops, tubers, spices, flowers, and medicinal plants. On the occasion, the Prime Minister also interacted with farmers and scientists. Discussing the importance of these new crop varieties, Modi stressed on significance of value addition in agriculture. The farmers said that these new varieties will be highly beneficial as they will help reduce their expenditure and also have a positive impact on the environment. Meanwhile, Union Minister for Agriculture and Farmers Welfare Shivraj Singh Chouhan said that today is a historic day for farmers as the 109 varieties of 65 crops which have been released will help increase farmers' income, enhance production and reduce costs.



Women and Child Development Minister Annpurna Devi has emphasised the importance of collaborative efforts between Centre and States to ensure well-being of women and children across the country. The Minister said this while chairing her first national-level meeting with Ministers of Women and Child Development, Social welfare in States and Administrators and Lieutenant Governors in Union Territories via video conferencing yesterday. The Minister stressed that such collaboration is essential to realising the vision of a developed India. She also highlighted the Ministry's flagship programmes under Mission Saksham Anganwadi and Poshan 2.0, Mission Vatsalya and Mission Shakti. 21 out of 28 State Ministers participated in the meeting which focused on reviewing the progress of on-going programmes and future strategies for various key initiatives under the Ministry of Women and Child Development.



Deputy Chief Minister and Home Minister Y. Patton, has emphasized on recent political crisis in Bangladesh and its fallout in Nagaland. A release from the media cell informed that under the able guidance of the Deputy Chief Minister, the Civil Administration and the Police Department are closely monitoring the situation. It said, to ensure that the political crisis in Bangladesh does not lead to an unnatural influx of migrants into the State, the Deputy Commissioners of all the districts have been instructed to immediately activate the District Security Coordination Committees. Further, they have been advised to keep a close vigil in the border areas and directed to maintain close co-ordination with their Assam counterparts and instruction for keeping all channels of communication open for prompt sharing of information has also been given. The State Government led by the District Administration and Police are alive to the unfolding situation. It further said, with the help of the robust village administration, civil society organizations and the public at large, we are well-prepared to deal with any situation that may arise.
