Prime Minister Narendra Modi virtually inaugurated the Integrated Aqua Park at Tarin in Ziro, Lower Subansiri District along with multiple others across the country from Maharashtra yesterday. Chief Minister Pema Khandu in a social media post said that the agua park in Ziro is set to transform the fisheries sector in the state and boost local livelihoods and tourism. He said it will significantly enhance local aquaculture, foster livelihood and create new income opportunities for farmers. State Fisheries Minister Gabriel Wangsu, who joined the inauguration programme from the project site at Tarin, termed it as a momentous day for the state. He informed the gathering that the Agua Park developed under Pradhan Mantri Matsya Sampada Yojana is the lone major project being implemented in the country under the scheme. He called upon the vouth and entrepreneurs to make the most out of the multiple facilities available at the park.
