Janmashtami is being celebrated with great enthusiasm across the country today. Speaking on the occasion, President Droupadi Murmu extended her greetings, urging people to embrace Lord Krishna's teachings and work towards the nation's progress. Prime Minister Narendra Modi through social media post has also extended his wishes on the occasion. Meanwhile, Governor of Arunachal Pradesh, Lt. General K.T. Parnaik (Retd.), also extended his greetings on the occasion to the people of the state and emphasized the importance of Krishna's teachings from the 'Bhagavad Gita,' urging people to follow messages of love, compassion, and duty. Taking it to the social media Chief Minister Pema Khandu also extended his heartfelt greetings to the people on the occasion of Janmashtami and wished everyone a joyful celebration of the birth of Nandalal, Murli Manohar, and Keshav, and prayed for Lord Krishna's blessings to bring joy, love, and prosperity into people's lives.

"Making justice as simple and clear as possible is a collective responsibility" Prime Minister Narendra Modi said this while addressing a closing ceremony of the Platinum Jubilee Celebration of the Rajasthan High Court in Jodhpur yesterday. Speaking on the occasion, Mr. Modi highlighted recent historic steps towards streamlining justice delivery, including repealing obsolete laws and modernizing systems, such as the e-court project which has computerized over 18,000 courts, providing significant relief to citizens. He also highlighted the role of alternative dispute mechanisms in enhancing ease of living and justice. During the event, Modi virtually inaugurated the Rajasthan High Court Museum and launched the 'TWARIT' (Timely Working Capital Assistance to Revitalise Industries) program.

Sanjay Roy, the main accused in the brutal rape and murder case at R G Kar Medical College and Hospital, Kolkata underwent a polygraph test yesterday. The CBI team conducted the test at the Presidency Correctional Home, spending four hours there. Earlier, Sanjay was also interrogated by forensic psychologists and behavioral experts from New Delhi. Meanwhile, the former superintendent of R G Kar, Bulbul Mukherjee, and other key figures,

including police officers and hospital staff, were also questioned at the CGO Complex, Salt Lake. The CBI also visited the residence of Chandan Louha, an associate of former Principal Dr. Sandip Ghosh, in connection with financial irregularities at the hospital. The investigation has led the CBI to interrogate several other individuals, including the new principal, vice principal, and various professors. The CBI has also raided the residence of Suman Hazra, a close associate of Dr. Ghosh, in Howrah, where the investigation is ongoing.

A free health camp was held yesterday at Seram village, Mebo Subdivision, organized by Siang Trust. The camp was inaugurated by District Medical Officer Dr. Komling Perme, with participation from specialists including Ophthalmologist Dr. Beauty Borang Perme, General Physician Dr. Saibal Bhattacharjee, and Orthodontist Dr. Dominic Pao. The event was supported by Siang Trust's Vice President, Group Captain Mohonto Panging Pao (Rtd), and local village leaders. A total of 90 patients were examined, including 55 eye and 15 dental cases with free tests and medicines provided during the camp.

A devastating fire broke out at Airport Colony yesterday around 4:30 pm, reducing many houses to ashes and causing property damage worth several crores. The cause of the fire and the exact number of houses affected are yet to be determined, but no human casualties have been reported. Fire tenders and police teams managed to control the blaze by 6:30 pm, with additional support from Dumporijo. Community volunteers trained in disaster management also assisted in evacuating properties and managing public movement. Further assessment of property loss will be conducted by the District Administration today.

A new book titled A Guide on Home Gardening in East Kameng District, Arunachal Pradesh, authored by Mrs. Ajum Bagang, was released by Dr. M. Q. Khan, Principal of Dera Natung Govt. College (DNGC), at the Department of Botany, DNGC, Itanagar yesterday. Speaking on the occasion, Dr. Khan praised the author's dedication and highlighted the importance of home gardens for sustainable development. The book is part of Mrs. Bagang's research on home gardens in East Kameng district. She has been an Assistant Professor at DNGC since 2014 and is pursuing a PhD under Prof. Sumpam Tangjang at Rajiv Gandhi University.
