Prime Minister Narendra Modi has said that the youth of the nation has benefited a lot by the Space Sector reforms. Addressing the nation in his Mann Ki Baat programme on Akashvani today, the Prime Minister said, a lot is happening in the country which is strengthening the foundation of a developed Bharat. He said, on 23rd of this month, the countrymen celebrated the first National Space Day and celebrated the success of Chandrayan-3. He said, last year, on this day, Chandrayan -3 had made a successful landing on the southern part of the moon at the Shiv-Shakti point. The Prime Minister said, India became the first nation in the world to achieve this accomplishment. Modi also interacted with a team from Spacetech Start-Up GalaxEye which was launched by the alumni of IIT-Madras. The Prime Minister

said that the Space ecosystem is becoming very vibrant. Speaking on the bond of love between human beings and animals, the Prime Minister spoke about a tiny village Barekuri in the Tinsukia district of Assam where people belonging to the Moran community reside and share a deep bond with the Hoolock Gibbons. Modi urged people to take part in Catch the Rain Movement and also in the Ek Ped Maa Ke Naam campaign. He requested countrymen to plant more and more trees. Modi said, in the next few days the Paralympics will begin in Paris and 140 crore Indians are cheering for the athletes and players of the country. The Prime Minister asked people to encourage the players with Hashtag Cheer4bharat.



Deputy Adviser (Forestry), S.K.M. Guite, Research Investigator from Department of Land Resources, Ministry of Rural Development New Delhi, Abid Hussain and expert from Himmotthan Society, Dehradun Vargish Bamola visited Nagaland to monitor the implementation of Pradhan Mantri Krishi Sinchayee Yojana-Watershed Development Component (PMKSY-WDC 2.0) projects and springs rejuvenation works. The team accompanied by officials of the State's Department of Land Resources visited project locations at Kohima and Peren districts from August 22 to 23. The visiting officials inspected Springshed management work at Thizama village which was implemented under PMKSY-WDC 1.0. Head GB Thizama village Neizelie Zatsu, thanked the Ministry and Department of Land Resource for extending drinking water to around 200 households through springs rejuvenation works at Thizama. The Department informed that pipelines and water storage tanks were provided under JJM Scheme by Public Health Engineering Department Nagaland. The officials also visited Percolation tanks, bench terraces, Banana plantation and Coffee plantations at Zhadima and coffee processing plant of Naga Tribal Coffee at Tsiesema. In Peren, the team visited Gaili Namdi village and Inbung village to monitor the implementation of springs

rejuvenation works and natural resource management works under the project. The Deputy Adviser appreciated the community participation in watershed project implementation, economic benefits and employment avenues generated through the programme and hinted that more projects will be covered under PMKSY-WDC 3.0.
